

SUBJECT: Petition of the City School District of the City of Watervliet for Consent to Exceed the Constitutional Debt Limit

SUMMARY

Issue for Decision (Consent Agenda)

Should the Regents consent to allow the City School District of the City of Watervliet to increase the indebtedness of the school district under the provisions of the State Constitution and the Local Finance Law?

Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by Article 8, Section 4, Paragraph (h) of the State Constitution and by Local Finance Law section 104.00(c).

Proposed Handling

This petition for consent will come before the Full Board at its October 2020 meeting for discussion and action.

Procedural History

The Board of Regents is required to give consent for such petitions prior to the petition being forwarded to the State Comptroller for final consideration. The Board of Regents has, in the past, discussed similar requests from school districts to exceed their debt limit and is familiar with the guidelines and procedures for granting consent.

Background Information

The Department received a petition from the Board of Education of the City School District of the City of Watervliet seeking consent of the Board of Regents to an increase in the indebtedness of the City School District of the City of Watervliet.

The State Constitution requires that any increase in the constitutional limit on local indebtedness for a school district wholly or partly within a city of less than 125,000 inhabitants receive: (1) the approving vote of 60 percent or more of the duly qualified voters; (2) the consent of the Regents; and (3) the consent of the State Comptroller.

According to the petition, the City School District of the City of Watervliet is located in the County of Albany and contains the City of Watervliet and a portion of the Town of Colonie. The documentation supporting the petition verifies that more than 60 percent of duly qualified voters approved the increase at a special meeting held on February 4, 2020. The amount requested for approval by the Board of Regents is \$9,996,825, to be used to fund a capital project consisting of the reconstruction and construction of improvements to School District facilities, including incidental costs and expenses in connection therewith.

Staff has reviewed the petition and supporting documentation and recommends that the requested consent be granted.

Related Regents Items

In 2012, the Board of Regents and the State Comptroller consented to and approved a prior request in the amount of \$18,950,000 from the Board of Education of the City School District of the City of Watervliet. See prior Regents Item:

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Regents take the following action:

VOTED: That the Board of Regents hereby gives consent to the issuance of bonds and/or bond anticipation notes by the Board of Education of the City School District of the City of Watervliet in an amount not to exceed \$9,996,825 for a capital project consisting of the reconstruction and construction of improvements to School District facilities,

including incidental costs and expenses in connection therewith, in excess of the constitutional debt limit of said school district.

Timetable for Implementation

Upon approval by the Board of Regents, the petition will be forwarded to the State Comptroller for final consideration.
