SUMMARY

Issue for Consent Agenda

Should the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions pertaining to licensing petitions as listed on the attachment?

Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by State Statute.

Proposed Handling

This question will come before the full board at its December 11, 2018 meeting where it will be voted on and action taken.

Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and §24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

Background Information

There are five licensing petitions and seven requests for the conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine for review and approval.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions regarding licensing petitions and degree conferrals.

Timetable for Implementation

Approval of the Committee on the Professions' recommendations will be effective, December 11, 2018.

(Bemidji State University, Bemidji, Minnesota, Bachelor of Science, August 2013)

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

Statement of Problem: Ms. Kaneko, an applicant for licensure as a CPA, recently passed the four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, the applicant exceeded the 18-month conditioning requirement by three days. Ms. Kaneko's Examination history data was subject to software failure and administrative problems within the scheduling system for the Examination. She received conditional credit for the Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) section in April 2015 and needed to pass the three remaining sections of the Examination by December 31, 2016 to retain credit for BEC. Within the 18-month conditioning period, she passed the Auditing and Attestation (AUD) section in February 2016 and the Regulation (REG) section in July 2016. Ms. Kaneko also sat for the Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) section in October 2016 within the 18-month conditioning period, but she did not pass. Ms. Kaneko passed FAR in the next testing window, January 2017; however, it was three days outside of the 18-month conditioning period.

During the January 2017 scheduling of the FAR section, the applicant experienced an administrative and technical failure of the software that prevented her from rescheduling the BEC section that had expired. Due to an administrative and technical glitch, NASBA's testing system provided incorrect information and the applicant was not allowed to re-sit for the BEC section.

Based on these unique circumstances and NASBA's documentation that this was an administrative and technical failure for which the applicant had no control, the Executive Secretary for the State Board for Public Accountancy supports Ms. Kaneko's request to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

(State University of New York at Oneonta, Oneonta, New York, Bachelor of Science, May 2012)

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Mr. Titov, an applicant for licensure as a CPA, recently passed the four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, the applicant exceeded the 18-month conditioning requirement by two days. Mr. Titov's Examination history data was subject to software failure and administrative problems within the scheduling system for the Examination.

He received conditional credit for the Auditing and Attestation (AUD) section in April 2014, but he did not pass all three remaining sections within the 18-month conditioning period of December 31, 2015. His new 18-month conditioning period was based on him passing the Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) section in April 2015. His conditioning period was then reset to December 31, 2016. Mr. Titov then re-passed AUD in October 2016 and Regulation (REG) in November 2016 within the reset 18-month conditioning period. However, the applicant was not able to pass the Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) section within that 18-month conditioning period despite three attempts and his FAR section expired.

Mr. Titov passed the Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) section in January 2017, two days outside of the new conditioning period. During the January 2017 scheduling of the BEC section, the applicant experienced an administrative and technical failure of the software that prevented him from rescheduling the FAR section that had expired. Due to an administrative and technical glitch, NASBA's testing system provided incorrect information and the applicant was not allowed to re-sit for the FAR section.

Based on these unique circumstances and NASBA's documentation that this was an administrative and technical failure for which the applicant had no control, the Executive Secretary for the State Board for Public Accountancy supports Mr. Titov's request to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

(King Saudi University, Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, Bachelor of Medicine Bachelor of Surgery, January 2003)

Petition for: Endorsement of his medical license from Saudi Arabia.

Statement of Problem: Commissioner's Regulations allow endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination. A license granted in a foreign country can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination, clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Representatives from the State Board for Medicine have reviewed the documentation submitted in support of Dr. Aljudaibi's application. The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Aljudaibi's Canadian Post Graduate Training between 2005 and 2013 be accepted as the substantial equivalent of the three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training required for licensure.

Commissioner's Regulations allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses and diplomate certificates to fulfill the licensure, proficiency, and clinical competency requirements for licensure by endorsement. Dr. Aljudaibi obtained his medical license in Saudi Arabia in 2004. His Saudi Arabian license is active and in good standing. Dr. Aljudaibi is certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine in Internal Medicine as of August 2008 and Gastroenterology as of November 2011 and is certified by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in Internal Medicine as of June 2009 and Gastroenterology as of October 2011.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Aljudaibi's Saudi Arabian license be endorsed, and his certifications be accepted to fulfill the proficiency examination and the clinical competency requirements for endorsement.

(Flinders University of South Australia, Bedford Park, Australia, Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery, June 1994)

Petition for: Endorsement of her medical license from Australia.

Statement of Problem: Commissioner's Regulations allow endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination. A license granted in a foreign country can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination, clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Representatives from the State Board for Medicine have reviewed the documentation submitted in support of Dr. Kent's application. The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Kent's Australian Post Graduate Training between 1994 and 2001 be accepted as the substantial equivalent of the three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training required for licensure.

Commissioner's Regulations allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses and diplomate certificates to fulfill the licensure, proficiency, and clinical competency requirements for licensure by endorsement. Dr. Kent obtained her medical license in Australia in 1994. Her Australian license is active and in good standing. Dr. Kent has a Doctor of Medicine degree from The Australian National University and is a Fellow of the Royal Australian College of Physicians of December 2000.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Kent's Australian license be endorsed, and her Doctorate and Fellowship be accepted to fulfill the proficiency examination and the clinical competency requirements for endorsement.

(University of Palermo, Palermo, Italy, Diploma in Medicine and Surgery, December 1985)

Petition for: Endorsement of his medical license from Italy.

Statement of Problem: Commissioner's Regulations allow endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination. A license granted in a foreign country can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination, clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Representatives from the State Board for Medicine have reviewed the documentation submitted in support of Dr. La Francesca's application. The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. La Francesca's Italian and United States Post Graduate Training between 1986 and 1994 be accepted as the substantial equivalent of the three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training required for licensure.

Commissioner's Regulations allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses and diplomate certificates to fulfill the licensure, proficiency, and clinical competency requirements for licensure by endorsement. Dr. La Francesca obtained his medical license in Italy in 1996. His Italian license is active and in good standing. Dr. La Francesca is ECFMG certified and holds a diploma as Doctor and Surgeon Specializing in Cardiovascular Surgery issued by University of Rome as of July 1991.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. La Francesca's Italian license be endorsed, and his ECFMG certification and Specialization diploma be accepted to fulfill the proficiency examination and the clinical competency requirements for endorsement.

<u>Petition for</u>: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

<u>Summary Statement</u>: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
