SUMMARY

Issue for Decision (Consent)

Should the Board of Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions pertaining to licensing petitions and degree conferrals as listed on the attachment?

(Christian-Albrechts University, Faculty of Dentistry, Kiel, Germany, Zahnartzliche Prufung, June 2008)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

Statement of Problem: Part 61.1 (a) of the Regulations of the Commissioner requires an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable preprofessional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of preprofessional and professional education.

Part 24.3(a)(1) of the Rules of the Board of Regents allows the Committee on the Professions the authority to waive up to six semester hours of preprofessional education, and §24.3(a)(2) of the Rules of the Board of Regents gives the Committee on the Professions the authority to accept postsecondary study after completion of professional study in lieu of up to 30 semester hours of preprofessional study.

Dr. Nicolaev completed a five-year professional dental education program at Christian-Albrechts University in Kiel, Germany. Therefore, she lacks one year (30 semester credits) of education, which is in the preprofessional area. However, Dr. Nicolaev also completed over one year of graduate-level specialty training in Implant Dentistry at Christian-Albrechts University.

Additionally, part 61.1 (b) of the Regulations of the Commissioner specifies that an applicant who completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school must complete the required two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program, culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Dr. Nicolaev enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry program at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in April 2020. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

(Peking University, School of Stomatology, Beijing, China, Bachelor of Stomatological Medicine, July 2014)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

Statement of Problem: Regulations of the Commissioner require an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable preprofessional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of preprofessional and professional education.

Part 24.3(a)(1) of the Rules of the Board of Regents allows the Committee on the Professions the authority to waive up to six semester hours of preprofessional education, and §24.3(a)(2) of the Rules of the Board of Regents gives the Committee on the Professions the authority to accept postsecondary study after completion of professional study in lieu of up to 30 semester hours of preprofessional study.

Dr. Wang completed a five-year professional dental education program at Peking University in Beijing, China. Therefore, he lacks one year (30 semester credits) of education, which is in the preprofessional area. However, Dr. Wang also completed three years of graduate education culminating in a Doctor of Stomatological Medicine at Peking University.

Additionally, an applicant who completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school must complete the required two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program, culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Dr. Wang enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry program at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in April 2020. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

(Northeastern State University, Tahlequah, Oklahoma, O.D., 1989)

Petition for: Waiver of New York State practical examination requirement.

Statement of Problem: Dr. Cox has not passed a satisfactory practical examination as required for licensure either by the endorsement or examination route. New York State accepts a passing score on Part III of the National Board of Examiners in Optometry (NBEO) examination to satisfy the practical examination requirement. The NBEO practical examination was not available when Dr. Cox was licensed in Tennessee in 1990.

Dr. Cox has documented over 20 years of licensed practice in Tennessee.

Based on Dr. Cox's demonstration of clinical skills through his years of hands-on licensed practice, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Optometry recommends that the requirement for a satisfactory practical examination (NBEO Part III) be considered satisfied, pursuant to §6506.5 of Education Law.

(Baylor College of Medicine, Houston, Texas, Doctor of Medicine, May 1975)

Petition for: Acceptance of the Texas state-constructed medical licensing examination taken after January 1, 1972.

Statement of Problem: Applicants may be considered for endorsement of an out-of-state medical license based on a state-constructed examination taken prior to January 1, 1972, provided that this examination and the required passing score were substantially equivalent to the New York State examination administered during the same time period. By January 1, 1972, the majority of states had adopted the Federation Licensing Examination (FLEX) as their medical licensing examination. Texas did not administer the FLEX examination until December 1975.

Dr. Hostetter was licensed by the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners after passing its June 1975 state-constructed medical licensing examination. The Department had determined that the Texas state-constructed medical examinations administered from 1922 through January 1, 1976 were substantially equivalent to the New York State medical licensing examinations. The Executive Director of the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners previously notified the Department that the state-constructed examination taken by the applicant in 1975 was equal to, if not superior to, any Texas State Board examination offered prior to January 1972. The applicant achieved scores on this examination that exceeded New York State requirements. Department staff support Dr. Hostetter's petition to accept the Texas state-constructed medical licensing examination as satisfying New York State's licensing examination requirement.

RECOMMENDATION: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine, recommends that the applicant's Texas state-constructed medical licensing examination be accepted to satisfy New York State's licensing examination requirement.

(University of Cordoba, Cordoba, Argentina, Physician and Surgeon, March 1997)

Petition for: Endorsement of his medical license from Belgium.

Statement of Problem: Commissioner’s Regulations allow endorsement of an applicant’s license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and the applicant has not failed any part of New York State’s licensing examination. A license granted in a foreign country can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination, clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Representatives from the State Board for Medicine have reviewed the documentation submitted in support of Dr. Rolfo’s application. The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Rolfo’s Post Graduate training in Argentina and Italy between January 1997 and June 2004 be accepted as the substantial equivalent of the three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training required for licensure.

Commissioner’s Regulations allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses and diplomate certificates to fulfill the licensure, proficiency, and clinical competency requirements for licensure by endorsement. Dr. Rolfo obtained his medical license in Belgium in August 2012. His Belgium license is active and in good standing. Dr. Rolfo holds Certification in Oncology from the University of Milan, issued November 2003, a Doctor of Philosophy degree in Clinical Oncology, Applied Experimental Oncology and Tumor Morphology from the University of Palermo, issued March 2010 and a Master’s degree in Management and Organization of Hospitals and Health Services from Polytechnic University, issued February 2012.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Rolfo’s Belgium license be endorsed, and his Certification in Oncology and master’s and Doctor of Philosophy degrees be accepted to fulfill the proficiency examination and the clinical competency requirements for endorsement.

RECOMMENDATION: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine, recommends that the applicant's qualifications be accepted to fulfill the requirements for licensure by endorsement.

MEDICINE

Petition for: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

Summary Statement: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
