College Scorecard

Prospective students can search by:

- Institution's Name
- Location – zip code, state and region
- Type – size based on enrollment, distance education, campus setting (urban, rural, suburban)
- Area of Interest – degree and major, occupation, awards offered



College Scorecard

Each scorecard includes the following items, with an indication of how the data compares to that of similar institutions:

- Institution's location, level and total undergraduate enrollment
- Costs – the average net price for undergraduates at the institution, academic year 2010-2011
- Graduation Rate – the graduation rate for full-time, first-time degree or certificate seeking students who began at the institution and graduated in 2011
- Loan Default Rate – the institution's three-year federal student loan cohort default rate (2008-2011). The national cohort default rate is also displayed
- Median Borrowing – the median amount of federal student loans borrowed for students' undergraduate study at the institution

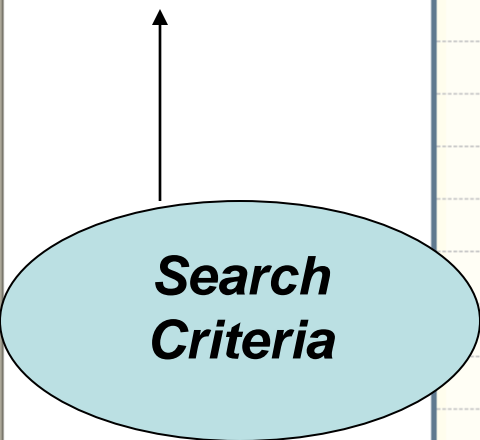

What does it typically cost to attend Adelphi University?
 The average net price for undergraduate students is \$25,516 per year. Net price is what undergraduate students pay after grants and scholarships (financial aid you don't have to pay back) are subtracted from the institution's cost of attendance.
 The average net price has increased 7.3% from 2007 to 2012.

What percentage of students graduate?
 65.5% of full-time students received their bachelor's degree within 6 years and 26.3% transferred to another institution. Graduation rate data are based on undergraduate students who enrolled full-time and have never enrolled in college before. This may not represent all undergraduates that attend the institution.

Are students able to repay their loans after they graduate?
 4.6% of borrowers defaulted on their Federal student loans within three years of entering repayment.

Median Borrowing

 Families typically borrow \$22,462 in Federal loans for a student's undergraduate study. The Federal loan payment over 10 years for this amount is approximately \$255.49 per month. Your borrowing may be different.

Advantages of this Approach

- Provides another resource to assist students in making informed college choices.
- Presents data in a consumer-friendly, graphical and interactive way.
- Provides a comparison of an institution's data to the data of institutions that primarily grant the same level of degree award (i.e., bachelor's degree institutions to bachelor's degree institutions)
- Continues the drive for greater transparency and accountability in higher education.
- Links consumers directly to each college's net price calculators – these are required to be posted on each college's website



College Scorecard

Potential Areas for Improvement

- Narrowly focused on vocational success, and does not consider the success institutions may have in achieving other missions, e.g., building character and moral judgment, turning out good, active citizens, etc.
- Does not provide a side-by-side comparison of multiple institutions, as do other sites (e.g., The College Board's Big Future)
- Lacks simple definition of key terms, e.g., default, 10-year repayment plan, Federal student loan
- Does not distinguish between the types of institutions and the population they serve
