





GED Pass Rates



SED requirements for Adult Education Programs



Students must accrue a minimum of 12 contact hours before they are counted in the data system



The program must record a valid pre-test before the first 12 hours lapse



The class roster must not exceed 20 students




The program must provide a valid post-test after 100 hours of instruction




Programs operating under EPE state aid must use certified K-12 or certificated adult education teachers







Requirements for Adults and Youth to Receive a HSE Diploma

The GED® Test Battery consists of five subtests in the following subject areas:

**Language
Arts -
Writing**

**Language
Arts -
Reading**

**Social
Studies**

Science

Mathematics

Students must earn a minimum total score of 2250 on the GED® Test Battery to earn an HSE Diploma. It is recommended that students who are referred for testing should earn a score of 2500 on the Official GED Practice Test™ or the equivalent readiness test score for the TASC.

Youth in Alternative High School Equivalency Preparation (AHSEP) Programs

School Year 2012-13



Students eligible for the Alternative High School Equivalency Preparation Program (AHSEP)

**Students who are 16-21 years of age ;
Students must complete the school year in which they turned 16, or such older maximum compulsory age as the board of education of the school district may require for school attendance**

**If a student who has dropped out of school wants to enroll in an AHSEP Program,
they must have district approval & are transferred to the AHSEP Program**

To determine eligibility, a formula is used that factors in the number of units of credit required by the school district for a local diploma, the number of years the student has been in grades 9-12, and the number of units of credit the student earned.

SED requirements for Alternative High School Equivalency Preparation (AHSEP) Program approval



Must offer students a minimum of 12 hours of instruction per week.



Must operate at least 150 hours during the school year.



The class register must not exceed 20 students.



The program must include a workforce preparation component.




