## Proposed Handling

## Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

## **Background Information**

There are six licensing petitions and 21 requests for the conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine for review and approval.

## **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions regarding licensing petitions.

<u>15-03-07</u> Nicole Carr Auburn, New York 13021

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Nicole Carr, an applicant for licensure as a CPA, recently passed the four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, she exceeded the 18-month time conditioning period in which to complete the examination requirements.

Ms. Carr received conditional credit for passing the Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) section of the Examination on her first attempt in July 2013. Under the 18-month conditioning requirements, she needed to pass the remaining three sections by March 31, 2015 in order to retain credit for BEC.

Ms. Carr sat for and passed the Auditing and Attestation (AUD) section on her first attempt in October 2013. She sat for and passed the Regulation (REG) section on her first attempt in January 2014. She sat for and failed the Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) section of the exam once before passing it in on her second attempt in May 2015, two months after she lost conditional credit for BEC.

Ms. Carr scheduled to sit for the FAR section of the exam within the conditioning period; however, she was unable to do so due to a documented medical condition. She scheduled to sit for and passed the final section in the next available testing window.

Based on the documentation provided and Ms. Carr's success on all four parts of the Examination, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports her petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: An applicant for licensure in dentistry who has completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school is required to complete two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school.

Dr. Kadempour completed three years of ADA-accredited advanced study in Prosthodontics at New York University in New York, New York from September 2012 to May 2015. The Executive for the State Board for Dentistry recommends that his advanced education at New York University be considered as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: An applicant for licensure in dentistry who has completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school is required to complete two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school.

Dr. Pernapati enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in June 2015. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: An applicant for licensure in dentistry who has completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school is required to complete two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school.

Dr. Syrrakou enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in June 2014. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

(Universidad de Monterey, San Pedro Garza, Mexico, Titulo de Medico Cirujano Dentista, August 2013)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Regulations of the Commissioner require an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable preprofessional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of preprofessional and professional education.

Dr. Flores Sousa completed a five-year combined preprofessional and professional dental education program at Universidad de Monterrey in San Pedro Garza, Mexico. Therefore, she lacks one year of education which is in the preprofessional area.

However, Dr. Flores Sousa also completed a two-year Master of Science degree in Business from September 2013 to March 2015 at University Rochester in Rochester, New York. The State Board for Dentistry recommends that these studies be considered to fulfill the remaining one year of required preprofessional education.

Additionally, an applicant who completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school must complete the required two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program, culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Dr. Flores Sousa also completed two years of ADA-accredited advanced study in General Dentistry at University of Rochester Eastman School for Oral Health in Rochester, New York from June 2013 through June 2015. The State Board for Dentistry recommends that her advanced education be considered as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

<u>15-16-50</u> Yaling Liu Rochester, New York

(West China University of Medical Sciences, Chengdu, Sichuan, China, Bachelor of Medicine in Stomatology, June 1999)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Regulations of the Commissioner require an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable preprofessional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of preprofessional and professional education.

Dr. Liu completed a five-year combined preprofessional and professional dental education program at West China University of Medical Sciences in Chengdu, Sichuan, China. Therefore, she lacks one year of education which is in the preprofessional area.

However, Dr. Liu also completed five years of advanced dental studies culminating in a Doctor of Stomatology degree from September 2001 through June 2006 at Sichuan University in Chengdu, Sichuan, China. The Executive Secretary of State Board for Dentistry recommends that these studies be considered to fulfill the remaining one year of required preprofessional education.

Additionally, an applicant who completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school must complete the required two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program, culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Dr. Liu also completed two years of ADA-accredited advanced study in General Dentistry at University of Rochester Eastman School for Oral Health in Rochester, New York from June 2013 through June 2015. The Executive Secretary for the State Board for Dentistry recommends that her advanced education be considered as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

<u>Petition for</u>: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

<u>Summary Statement</u>: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
