SUMMARY

Issue for Consent Agenda

Should the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions pertaining to licensing petitions as listed on the attachment?

Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by State Statute.

Proposed Handling

This question will come before the full board at its February 23, 2016 meeting where it will be voted on and action taken.

Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

Background Information

There are six licensing petitions and 11 requests for the conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine for review and approval.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions regarding licensing petitions and degree conferrals.

Timetable for Implementation

Approval of the Committee on the Professions' recommendations will be effective February 23, 2016.

Petition for: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

Statement of Problem: Sagrada M. Manning, an applicant for licensure as a CPA, recently passed the four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, she exceeded the 18-month time conditioning period in which to complete the examination requirements.

Ms. Manning first passed two parts of the CPA Examination in November 2003, Business Environment and Concepts and Regulation; however she then failed Auditing and Attestation in May and November 2004, November 2005, 2006, and 2007 and July 2008. Ms. Manning also failed Financial Accounting and Reporting in November 2006 and re-sat for Regulation, but failed in January 2008.

Ms. Manning passed Regulation in January 2013, Auditing and Attestation in May 2013 and Financial Accounting and Reporting in October 2013. Ms. Manning did not meet the 18-month condition requirement as she failed the Business Environment and Concepts section of the Examination in January, May, August and October 2014 and May 2015. During this time period, she also lost credit for Regulation and Auditing and Attestation. She then re-sat and passed Regulation in January 2015 and in August 2015 passed Business Environment and Concepts.

Ms. Manning's ability to prepare and sit for the various sections of the Examination was impeded by the documented medical conditions of her son. Based on the medical documentation provided and Ms. Manning's success on all four parts of the Examination, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports her petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

Statement of Problem: Regulations of the Commissioner require an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable preprofessional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of preprofessional and professional education.

Dr. Asghar completed a four-year professional dental education program at Baqai Dental School in Karachi, Pakistan, Therefore, he lacks two years of education which is in the preprofessional area.

However, Dr. Asghar also completed one year of “A” level exams in Pakistan and a one-year fellowship in Orofacial Pain from July 2008 until June 2009 at the New Jersey Dental School in Newark, New Jersey. The Executive Secretary for the State Board for Dentistry recommends that these studies be considered to fulfill the two years of required preprofessional education.

Additionally, an applicant who completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school must complete the required two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program, culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Dr. Asghar also completed two academic years of ADA-accredited advanced study from September 2010 until June 2012 culminating in a Master of Dental Science degree with a specialty in Endodontics from the New Jersey Dental School in Newark, New Jersey. The Executive Secretary for the State Board for Dentistry recommends that her advanced education be considered as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

Statement of Problem: An applicant for licensure in dentistry who has completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school is required to complete two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school.

Dr. Krishna enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in June 2014. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

Statement of Problem: An applicant for licensure in dentistry who has completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school is required to complete two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school.

Dr. Liu enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in December 2013. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

Statement of Problem: Regulations of the Commissioner require an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable preprofessional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of preprofessional and professional education.

Dr. Tzouma completed a five-year combined preprofessional and professional dental education program at Aristotle University of Thessaloniki in Thessaloniki, Greece. Therefore, she lacks one year of education which is in the preprofessional area.

However, Dr. Tzouma also completed one year of advanced study in Endodontics for International Graduates from September 2010 through July 2011 at New York University in New York, New York. The Executive Secretary for the State Board for Dentistry recommends that these studies be considered to fulfill the one year of required preprofessional education.

Additionally, an applicant who completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school must complete the required two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program, culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Dr. Tzouma enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in June 2015. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

Petition for: Endorsement of her medical license from Italy.

Statement of Problem: Commissioner’s Regulations allow endorsement of an applicant’s license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and the applicant has not failed any part of New York State’s licensing examination. A license granted in a foreign country can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination, clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Representatives from the State Board for Medicine have reviewed the documentation submitted in support of Dr. Bodei’s application. The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Bodei’s Residency and Fellowship positions between 1995 and 2009 in Italy and the Netherlands be accepted as the substantial equivalent of the three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training required for licensure.

Commissioner’s Regulations allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses and diplomate certificates to fulfill the licensure, proficiency, and clinical competency requirements for licensure by endorsement. Dr. Bodei obtained her medical license in Italy in 1996. Her Italian license is active and in good standing. Dr. Bodei completed PhD studies in Nuclear Medicine at University of Groningen in 2009. Additionally, Dr. Bodei holds a diploma of Specialist in Nuclear Medicine by the University of Pisa.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Bodei’s Italian license be endorsed, that her PhD studies be accepted to fulfill the proficiency examination, and that her Specialty Diploma be accepted to fulfill the clinical competency requirements for endorsement.

MEDICINE

Petition for: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

Summary Statement: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
