SUMMARY

Issue for Decision

Should the Board of Regents approve the proposed revisions to the charters of the following schools authorized by the Board of Regents?

1. Evergreen Charter School

2. Riverhead Charter School

Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by State statute.

Proposed Handling

This issue will come before the Board of Regents P-12 Education Committee and the Full Board for action at its April 2020 meeting.

Procedural History

The New York State Education Department (the Department) is making recommendations to the Board of Regents for approval and issuance of charter revisions as required by Article 56 of the Education Law.

Background Information

The Department recommends that the Board of Regents amend the charters of the **Evergreen Charter School** and **Riverhead Charter School**. Information about the revision requests is provided below.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the Board of Regents take the following action:

VOTED: That the Board of Regents finds that: (1) the charter school meets the requirements set out in Article 56 of the Education Law, and all other applicable laws, rules and regulations; (2) the charter school can demonstrate the ability to operate in an educationally and fiscally sound manner; (3) granting the request to amend the charter is likely to improve student learning and achievement and materially further the purposes set out in subdivision two of section twenty-eight hundred fifty of Article 56 of the Education Law; and (4) granting the request to amend the charter will have a significant educational benefit to the students expected to attend the charter school, and the Board of Regents therefore approves the charter revision for **Evergreen Charter School** and amends the provisional charter accordingly.

VOTED: That the Board of Regents finds that: (1) the charter school meets the requirements set out in Article 56 of the Education Law, and all other applicable laws, rules and regulations; (2) the charter school can demonstrate the ability to operate in an educationally and fiscally sound manner; (3) granting the request to amend the charter is likely to improve student learning and achievement and materially further the purposes set out in subdivision two of section twenty-eight hundred fifty of Article 56 of the Education Law; and (4) granting the request to amend the charter will have a significant educational benefit to the students expected to attend the charter school, and the Board of Regents therefore approves the charter revision for **Riverhead Charter School** and amends the provisional charter accordingly.

Timetable for Implementation

The Regents action for **Evergreen Charter School and Riverhead Charter School** will become effective immediately.

Proposed Revisions	 To Increase the current grade span to include Grades 9 - 12 from the school's current kindergarten through Grade 8 configuration; and To Increase authorized enrollment from 750 students to 1100 students beginning in the 2020-2021 school year and phased in gradually thereafter.

In January 2009, the Board of Regents approved and chartered the Evergreen Charter School (Evergreen) in the Hempstead Union Free School District. Evergreen's educational program focuses on the intellectual, physical, and social emotional development of each student through an integrated dual language model (Spanish and English) that promotes academic excellence and prepares its students for success in school and life.

Evergreen's trustees request that the Board of Regents approve a material revision to the school's charter to allow it to increase the current grade span to include Grades 9-12, and to increase authorized enrollment from 750 students to 1100 students beginning in the 2020-2021 school year and phased in gradually thereafter. This revision would allow the school to best serve current students by providing them the opportunity to remain with their peers in a dual-language, college preparatory academic program that integrates Hispanic culture and environmental sustainability. Evergreen currently has a wait list for enrollment at every grade-level, and for the past two years, the school has had over 500 families on its wait list.

Evergreen is a high performing charter school that exceeds NYSED Charter School Performance Framework standards and that equitably serves all students, including students with disabilities (SWDs), English language learners (ELLs)/Multilingual learners (MLLs), and economically disadvantaged (ED) students. The academic outcomes for Evergreen on the Grade 3-8 ELA State assessments are 23 percentage points above the district and 4 percentage points above the State. In Grade 3-8 math, they are 20 percentage points above the district and 1 percentage point below the State. Evergreen serves approximately the same number of SWDs (-1 percentage point) and ELLs/MLLs (+1 percentage point) as the district; but serves significantly more ED students (+19 percentage points). In its application to NYSED, Evergreen states that the impetus for

applying for this revision derives from parent demand to keep their children enrolled in Evergreen through high school rather than be forced to attend district high schools, which have poor outcomes and a poor track record of serving the Hispanic community.

Figure 1: Evergreen CS Academic Achievement Elementary/Middle School Assessment Proficiency State and District Differentials Over Time



In January 2001, the Board of Regents approved and chartered the Riverhead Charter School (RCS) in the Riverhead Central School District. RCS' educational program focuses on providing a robust academic curriculum that prepares students to be successful in high school and beyond.

RCS' trustees request that the Board of Regents approve a material revision to its charter to allow the school to increase enrollment by 63 students to be phased in over the next two school years. This revision would allow RCS to offer its successful academic program to additional students currently on the waiting list.

RCS students outperform both the Riverhead Central School District as well as the State average on grade 3-8 math and ELA exam outcomes. This is also true for all sub-groups — SWDs, ELLs/MLLs, and economically disadvantaged students, with the exception of ELL/MLL students at RCS performing slightly below the State average but above the district average in math.

Figure 1: Riverhead CS Academic Achievement Elementary/Middle School Assessment Proficiency State and District Differentials Over Time


