**Issue for Decision** 

Should the Regents approve the proposed renewal charters for eleven charter schools authorized by the Chancellor of the New York City Department of Education (NYCDOE)?

### Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by State Statute.

### **Proposed Handling**

This issue will be before the Regents P-12 Education Committee and the Full Board for action at the January 2013 Regents meeting.

### **Procedural History**

The Chancellor of the NYCDOE approved these eleven renewal charters in December 2012 and submitted them to the Regents for approval and issuance of the renewal charters as required by Article 56 of the Education Law, The New York State Charter School Statute. As indicated in the Chancellor's letter (Attachment A), he has approved full five-year renewals for six of the schools, a five-year renewal with conditions for one school, and three-year renewals with conditions for four of the schools.

# **Background Information**

I recommend that the Board of Regents approve the proposed renewal charters for the following charter schools as proposed by the Chancellor of the New York City Department of Education (NYCDOE) in his capacity as a charter school authorizer under Article 56 of the Education Law, and that the charters be extended for the terms indicated. The Executive Summary from the NYCDOE's Renewal Report for each school is attached to this item (Attachment B).
