SUMMARY

Issue for Decision (Consent)

Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

Background Information

There are two licensing petitions and ten requests for the conferral of the degree of Doctor of Medicine for review and determination.

23-02-79 Camila Sampaio New York, New York

(Universidade Estadual de Campinas, Sao Paulo, Brazil, Titulo de Cirujana Dentista, February 2011)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Section 6604-b of Article 133 of the Education Law requires an applicant for restricted dental faculty license to have completed a total of no less than six academic years of pre-professional and professional education, including: courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics; and not less than four academic years of professional dental education satisfactory to the department.

Immediately after secondary school, Dr. Sampaio completed a four-year professional dental education program at Universidade Estadual de Campinas, in Sao Paulo, Brazil. Following that, she completed a two-year Masters degree in Dental Materials and a three-year Doctor of Dental Materials at Universidade Estadual de Campinas, in Sao Paolo, Brazil.

Although Dr. Sampaio has over six years of combined education in dentistry, her education does not exhibit the pattern of two years of preprofessional education followed by a four-year dental program as expected. The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Dentistry recommends that Dr. Sampaio's combination of studies be accepted to fulfill the education requirement.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Dentistry, recommends that the applicant's education requirements be considered fulfilled.

MEDICINE 23-117-60 Ola Kvist Stockholm, Sweden

(University of Gothenburg, Gothenburg, Sweden, Physician's Examination, January 2008)

<u>Petition for:</u> Endorsement of applicant's medical license from Sweden.

Statement of Problem: Commissioner's Regulations allow endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination. A license granted in a foreign country can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination, clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the documentation submitted in support of Dr. Kvist's application. He recommends that Dr. Kvist's training from Sweden be accepted as the equivalent of the three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training required for licensure.

Commissioner's Regulations allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses and diplomate certificates to fulfill the license, proficiency, and clinical competency requirements for New York State licensure by endorsement. Dr. Kvist obtained his medical license in Sweden in 2010. His Swedish license is active and in good standing. Additionally, Dr. Kvist is a Radiology Specialist in Sweden as of 2015 and obtained his Doctor of Philosophy in Medical Science in 2022.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Kvist's Swedish license be endorsed and his Doctor of Philosophy and specialty in Radiology be accepted to fulfill the proficiency examination and the clinical competency requirements for endorsement.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine, recommends that the applicant's qualifications be accepted to fulfill the requirements for licensure by endorsement.

MEDICINE

<u>Petition for</u>: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

<u>Summary Statement</u>: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
