### **REGENTS COMMITTEE ON HIGHER EDUCATION**

#### **Regents Committee on Higher Education Members**

The Higher Education Committee held its scheduled meeting on December 15, 2025. All members were present. Chancellor Lester W. Young, Jr., Regent Roger Tilles, Regent Christine D. Cea, Regent Susan W. Mittler, Regent Shino Tanikawa, Regent Patrick A. Mannion, and Regent Felicia Thomas-Williams also attended the meeting.

### **MATTERS NOT REQUIRING BOARD ACTION**

**A proposed amendment to sections 145-2.1 and 145-2.9 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education relating to Part-time Study for Undergraduate Students** - Department staff presented a proposed regulatory amendment to align

Commissioner Regulations with an amendment to New York State Education Law § 667-c, which lowered the minimum required credit load for the Part-Time Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) from 6 to 3 credit hours.

The 2025-26 Enacted State Budget (Part D of Chapter 56 of the Laws of 2025) consolidated three existing state financial aid programs for part-time students into a single Part-Time Tuition Assistance Program (TAP), as well as expanded eligibility for Part-Time TAP. Specifically, the Budget amended New York State Education Law § 667-c, lowering the minimum required credit load for the Part-Time TAP from 6 to 3 credit hours. This change affects students enrolled in an approved undergraduate degree program who are taking less than 12 credits per semester.

This new minimum credit hour requirement for Part-Time TAP applies to part-time students who are enrolled in an undergraduate degree program at participating New York institutions, including SUNY, CUNY, and independent colleges. Other requirements are unchanged: Students must still meet other eligibility requirements, including New York State residency, being in good standing on any student loans, and meeting income guidelines. Therefore, the Department proposes to amend section 145-2.1 to reflect this change.

Additionally, the Budget repealed section 666 of the Education Law regarding the Aid for Part-Time Study (APTS) Program. Therefore, the amendment removes references to this section in the Commissioner's regulations in sections 145-2.3 and 145-2.9.1.

Deputy Commissioner William Murphy reviewed the items on the Consent Agenda.

The P-12 Education Committee held its scheduled meeting on December 15, 2025. All members were present. Chancellor Lester W. Young, Jr., Regent Susan W. Mittler, Regent Adrian I. ## **MATTERS REQUIRING BOARD ACTION**

**SUNY-authorized New Charter School Applications [P-12 (A) 1]** - Department staff presented recommendations regarding three new SUNY-authorized charter schools.

NYSED is recommending that the Board of Regents return the applications for the following charter schools due to significant community opposition:

- The Academy Charter School Brentwood Elementary – Approved to open Fall 2026
- The Academy Charter School Brentwood Middle – Approved to open Fall 2026
- The Academy Charter School Central Islip Regional High – Approved to open Fall 2026

This recommendation follows precedent from 2021, when similar opposition led the Regents to return SUNY approvals for other schools for reconsideration.

The committee recommends that the Board of Regents return the proposed charters for **The Academy Charter School Brentwood Elementary, The Academy Charter School Brentwood Middle, and The Academy Charter School Central Islip Regional High** to the Trustees of the State University of New York for reconsideration, with the following comment and recommendation, “The Regents are unable to make the required findings in accordance with Education Law §2852(2), including, but not limited to, the findings that granting the applications is likely to improve student learning and achievement and materially further the purposes set out in subdivision two of section twenty-eight hundred fifty of Article 56 of the Education Law. In addition, there is significant community opposition to the proposed schools that must be considered. The Regents encourage the SUNY Trustees to re-examine and consider the comments presented in the SUNY Summary of Findings and Recommendations for these applications, many in opposition to these charter applications, and to provide a substantive response to the concerns raised. These proposed charter actions should be abandoned.”

The motion passed unanimously.

## **ACTION ITEMS**

### **Professional Discipline Cases [PPC (A) 1 – 3]**

The Committee recommends that the reports of the Regents Review Committees, including rulings, findings of fact, determinations as to guilt, and recommendations, by unanimous or majority vote, contained in those reports which have been distributed to you, be accepted in 3 cases. In addition, your Committee recommends, upon the recommendation of the Committee on the Professions, that 15 consent order applications, and that 12 surrender applications be granted.

These recommendations are made following the review of 30 cases involving five certified public accountants, five licensed practical nurses, five registered professional nurses, three massage therapists, two certified public accountancy professional corporations, one architect, one architecture design professional corporation, one certified public accountancy professional service limited liability company, one licensed clinical social worker, one licensed master social worker, one licensed mental health counselor, one pharmacist, one registered professional nurse who is also nurse practitioner in Family Health, and one professional engineer.

The Professional Practice Committee recommends, and we move, that the Board of Regents act affirmatively upon each recommendation in the report of the Committee's deliberations at its meeting on December 16, 2025.

#### **Restorations [PPC (A) 4 - 5]**

The Committee recommends that the application of Nasreen Dharsee-Dungersi for the restoration of her license to practice as a pharmacist in New York State be granted, with Regent Brian Krist opposed.

The Committee recommends that the application of Louis A. Sidoti for the restoration of his license to practice as a physician in New York State be denied.

#### **Proposed Amendment of Section 29.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents and Section 63.14 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education Relating to the Practice Settings of Registered Pharmacy Technicians [PPC (A) 1]**

Department staff presented for emergency action a proposed amendment to Section 29.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents and Section 63.14 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education to conform them to Chapter 543 of the Laws of 2025, which became effective November 21, 2025, which permits registered pharmacy technicians to practice in any pharmacy under the supervision of a pharmacist.

The motion passed unanimously.

#### **MATTERS NOT REQUIRING BOARD ACTION**

#### **Proposed Amendment of Section 64.1 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education Relating to the Professional Study of Nursing [PPC (D) 1]**

Department staff proposed technical amendments to section 64.1(c) of the Commissioner's regulations to clarify the intent of Chapter 502 of the Laws of 2017 and Chapter 380 of the Laws of 2018, which are known as the BSN in 10 Law, by further prescribing which baccalaureate or higher degrees are acceptable to the Department to

satisfy the requirement that registered professional nurses must attain such degree in nursing within 10 years of licensure to continue to practicing in this State. The proposed technical amendments will clarify the BSN in 10 Law's exemptions for certain registered professional nurses from the requirement of attaining a baccalaureate or higher degree in nursing within 10 years of being issued a New York State registered professional nurse license.

Deputy Commissioner David Hamilton reviewed the items on the Consent Agenda.
