Revisions to a Charter Authorized by the Board of Regents: Syracuse Academy of Science Charter School

# Issue for Decision

Should the Regents approve the proposed revisions to the charter for Syracuse Academy of Science Charter School?

## Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by state statute.

## Proposed Handling

This issue will be before the P-12 Education Committee for discussion and action, and before the Full Board for action at the February meeting of the Board of Regents.

## **Background Information**

Syracuse Academy of Science Charter School requests to change the material terms of its charter:

- 1. to increase its maximum enrollment from 696 students to 975
- 2. increase the length of the school year with 15 additional days in the beginning of the year (195 days total)
- 3. serve grades 5-7 at a new east campus located outside the Syracuse City School District in the town of Geddes

The Board of Regents approved and chartered the Syracuse Academy of Science Charter School ("School") located in the Syracuse City School District in January 2003. SASCS opened in September 2003 with 200 students in grades 7-9. SASCS added grades 10, 11, and 12 in the subsequent three years, ending its first charter term with 350 students in grades 7-12. In December of 2007, the Board of Regents granted a first renewal charter to SASCS for five years. In May of 2010, the Board of Regents granted a revision to the SASCS charter to add grades K-2 and 5-6 during this first renewal term. During 2011-2012, SASCS served 600 students in grades K-2 and 5-12. In March 2012, the Board of Regents granted the School a second renewal charter for five years from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2017. In March 2013, the Regents approved a material revision to allow Syracuse Academy, to alter its mission statement to align with its sister school, Utica Academy of Science Charter School.

The School is now requesting an enrollment increase from 696 students to 975 students in grades K-12. The school believes the availability of open seats at SASCS will expand the educational opportunities to the target population of socio-economically needy students residing in the Syracuse City School District. Also, the School has requested to add an additional 15 school days to the beginning of the school year.

Syracuse Academy also requests a charter revision that would allow it to locate its middle school students (grades 5-7) in a former parochial school building site just beyond the Syracuse City School District limits in the town of Geddes. This additional school building site would allow the school to:

 place students at age-appropriate school campuses; Grades K-4 at the south elementary school campus in Syracuse, Grades 5-7 at the east middle school campus in the Town of Geddes, and Grades 8-12 at the central high school campus in Syracuse.  have extra instructional space at the central high school campus, which will allow the School to offer seven more advanced and college courses and will provide extra laboratory project-based learning spaces.

This revision would not alter the official district of location of Syracuse Academy of Science Charter School, which would remain the Syracuse City School District. Students who are residents of the Syracuse City School District would continue to receive the enrollment preference for available seats in the middle school grades, just as they do for the elementary and high school grades that would continue to be located within the Syracuse City School District.

Syracuse Academy of Science Charter School is a school "In Good Standing", and has never been identified for improvement under the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), also known as the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act.

In 2013, the School outperformed the Syracuse City School District as the district of location on the 3-8 State English Language Arts and Mathematics Assessments and in 2012, the School outperformed the district on the English Composition and Integrated Algebra Regents exams (see Tables 1 & 2 in the Attachment). Additionally, the School has provided interim data showing that its sister school, Utica Academy of Science, is performing as well on their interim exams as Syracuse Academy – a trajectory for positive outcomes on the School's New York State exams.

The Department reviewed audited financial statements for the School for 2007-2008 through 2010-2011. The school has continued to demonstrate good overall financial health and stability. The review showed that the school maintained a positive change in net assets each year resulting in an overall increase in the net asset balance from \$795,733 in 2007-2008 to \$2,763,630 in 2010-2011. Cash flow ending balances fluctuated but the ending balance in 2010-2011 was a positive \$1,690,550. The working capital ratio increased steadily each year.

## **Recommendation**

VOTED: That the Board of Regents finds that the proposed revised charter: (1) meets the requirements set out in Article 56 of the Education Law, and all other applicable laws, rules and regulations; (2) will operate in an educationally and fiscally sound manner; (3) is likely to improve student learning and achievement and materially further the purposes set out in subdivision two of section twenty-eight hundred fifty of Article 56 of the Education Law; and (4) will have a significant educational benefit to the students expected to attend the charter school, and the Board of Regents therefore approves the charter revision for Syracuse Academy of Science Charter School and amends the provisional charter accordingly.

## **Timetable for Implementation**

The Regents actions for Syracuse Academy of Science Charter School will become effective immediately.
