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#### SUMMARY

### **Issue for Decision**

Should the Regents approve the proposed revisions to the charters of the following three schools authorized by the New York City Department of Education Chancellor:

- 1. New Heights Academy Charter School
- 2. New York French American Charter School

## Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by State statute.

## **Proposed Handling**

This issue will be before the Board of Regents P-12 Education Committee and the Full Board for action at the February 2018 Regents meeting.

## **Procedural History**

The Commissioner and Department staff forward the revision recommendations for the following charter schools, as proposed by the New York City Department of Education Chancellor in her capacity as a charter school authorizer under Article 56 of the Education Law. The New York City Department of Education Chancellor asks that the charters be revised as indicated and has provided a summary for each school as set forth below.

#### **Rationale for Recommendation**

New Heights Academy Charter School was renewed for a 3-year, short-term renewal in the 2016-17 school year. New Heights is requesting an enrollment increase in order to provide an opportunity for the older siblings of current students to attend their school. Because New Heights has a high retention rate at the high school academy, the likelihood that these siblings will be called off of the wailtlist is low. Additionally, the parents of the current students would like to keep these siblings together, demonstrating parent satisfaction with the school and community demand. Per our 2015 Enrollment Revision Policy, New Heights is eligible to request an enrollment increase because they have submitted compelling rationale to support the evaluation of the request<sup>1</sup>. Not only is this rationale aligned with the Charter Schools Act to provide a preference for the siblings of currently enrolled students, the number of students being requested is small and will not have a noticeable impact on the enrollment of district and charter schools in the community.

#### **Summary of Public Comment**

#### **Rationale for Recommendation**

New York French American Charter School was renewed for a 5-year, full-term renewal in the 2016-17 school year. In the NYC DOE review of the material revision request, the charter authorizing team's (CAT) analytics review found that 77.4% of NYFACS alumni are currently attending a middle school that performs worse than NYFACS in both ELA and Math. NYFACS is performing significantly better in ELA (17 percentage points) and Math (39 percentage points) than the school that receives the highest concentration of NYFACS students for middle school (49% of NYFACS 5<sup>th</sup> graders attend this school for 6<sup>th</sup> grade). Additionally, NYFACS' enrollment plan accounts for the matriculation of students currently enrolled in the elementary school and does not call for the recruitment of additional students, thereby limiting the overall impact on enrollment at other district and charter schools in the community.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> 22% of New York French-American Charter School students reside in NYC CSD 5 and 16% reside in their district of location, NYC CSD 3. An additional 16% of students reside in NYC CSD 9 and the rest reside in 15 other CSDs across the city. Since the largest district of residence for students in this school is NYC CSD 5, comparisons both to the district of location, NYC CSD 3, and NYC CSD 5, are presented here.
