SUMMARY

Issue for Decision (Consent Agenda)

Should the Board of Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions pertaining to licensing petitions and degree conferrals as listed on the attachment?

Reason(s) for Consideration

Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

Background Information

There are five licensing petitions and 39 requests for the conferral of the degree of Doctor of Medicine for review and determination.

It is recommended that the Board of Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions regarding the licensing petitions and degree conferrals.

Petition for: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

Statement of Problem: Ms. Jeffrey is an applicant for licensure in New York as a CPA and recently passed all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, she exceeded the 18-month conditioning requirement by three months, or one conditioning period.

The applicant began sitting for the CPA Examination in July 2011 and had two previous conditioning periods. The first conditioning period that began in October 2016 when she passed Regulation (REG), expired on June 30, 2018 because she did not pass Business Environment and Concepts (BEC). The second conditioning period that began in April 2017 when she passed Auditing and Attestation (AUD), expired on December 31, 2018.

In the current conditioning period, she passed Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) in March 2018 and had to pass the remaining sections of the Examination by September 30, 2019. Ms. Jeffrey re-passed REG in December 2018 and passed AUD in July 2019. However, it was not until November 2019 that she passed BEC in this conditioning period.

Pursuant to §70.4(d), applicants may sit for the CPA Examination prior to satisfying the full education requirements for NYS Licensure. Ms. Jeffrey gained entry to the Examination, but her education has not yet been evaluated for the purpose of NYS Licensure.

Ms. Jeffrey's ability to properly prepare and sit for the sections of the Examination was impeded by her medical condition that occurred during all the conditioning periods.

Based on documentation provided by the licensed professional who treated Ms. Jeffrey and the applicant's perseverance on the various sections of the Examination, despite her medical condition, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports her petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

Petition for: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

Statement of Problem: Mr. Machina is an applicant for licensure in New York as a CPA and recently passed all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, he exceeded the 18-month conditioning requirement by nine months, or three testing windows.

The applicant passed Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) in March 2017, on his first attempt, and needed to pass the remaining three sections of the Examination by September 2018. Also, on his first attempt, he passed Auditing and Attestation (AUD) in April 2017. Mr. Machina was deployed on military training orders, within his 18-month conditioning window from June 2017 to September 2018. Therefore, he could not pass the remaining two sections of the Examination within the conditioning period. Upon his return from military deployment, he passed Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) in January 2019, after his second attempt and Regulation (REG) in June 2019, after his second attempt.

Pursuant to §70.4(d), applicants may sit for the CPA Examination prior to satisfying the full education requirements for NYS Licensure. Mr. Machina gained entry to the Examination, but his education has not yet been evaluated for the purpose of NYS Licensure.

Given that the applicant was deployed for military training for one year and three months during his 18-month conditioning period and upon his return he passed the remaining two sections of the Examination, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports his petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

Petition for: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

Statement of Problem: Mr. Warren, an applicant for licensure as a CPA, recently passed the four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, the applicant exceeded the 18-month conditioning requirement by three months or one testing window.

Mr. Warren was subject to a software failure with the Examination on the day of his scheduled test on February 22, 2019, within the 18-month conditioning window.

The applicant received conditional credit for Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) in August 2017, on his first attempt. He needed to pass the remaining three sections of the Examination by March 2019. Mr. Warren passed Auditing and Attestation (AUD) and Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) in December 2018 and February 2019, respectively, each on his first attempt. However, he was unable to pass Regulation (REG) by March 31, 2019 due to software malfunction, which caused him to lose credit for the FAR section of the Examination. Mr. Warren passed REG in June 2019, approximately three months outside his conditioning period.

Pursuant to §70.4(d), applicants may sit for the CPA Examination prior to satisfying the full education requirements for NYS Licensure. Mr. Warren gained entry to the Examination, but his education has not yet been evaluated for the purpose of NYS Licensure.

As noted above, there was a software failure that prevented Mr. Warren from sitting for REG on his scheduled test date in February 2019. The National Association of State Boards of Accountancy (NASBA) and Prometric (the test vendor) provided confirmation of the software malfunction.

Based on this unique circumstance and the documentation provided by NASBA and Prometric of the software malfunction that was beyond the applicant's control, the Executive Secretary for the State Board for Public Accountancy supports Mr. Warren's request to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSING

Leningrad Pediatric Medical Institute, now St. Petersburg Pediatric Medical Institute, St. Petersburg, Russia, Diploma of Nursing for Children’s Health Care Facilities, June 1987.

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

Statement of Problem: Ms. Vutov completed a three-year professional nursing program in the specialty area of pediatrics at the Leningrad Pediatric Medical Institute, now St Petersburg Pediatric Medical Institute, St. Petersburg, Russia. Ms. Vutov is requesting that her nursing program be accepted as the substantial equivalent of a registered general nursing program.

Section 6905 of New York State Education Law, and section §64.1(a)(3) of the Commissioner's Regulations, require that applicants for licensure in RPN must have received a diploma or degree in general nursing of at least two years in a country outside the United States or its territories and that the licensing authority or appropriate governmental agency of said country certifies to the Department as being preparation for practice as a registered professional nurse. Information previously provided by the school indicates that graduates of their pediatric nursing program are eligible to practice in medical institutions for adults as well as children.

RECOMMENDATION: The Committee on the Professions recommends that the applicant’s petition for acceptance of her nursing education be approved.

DENTISTRY

(University of Bonn, Bonn, Germany, Zahnartzliche Prufung, August 2004)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

Statement of Problem: Regulations of the Commissioner require an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable preprofessional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of preprofessional and professional education.

Part 24.3(a)(1) of the Rules of the Board of Regents allows the Committee on the Professions the authority to waive up to six semester hours of preprofessional education, and §24.3(a)(2) of the Rules of the Board of Regents gives the Committee on the Professions the authority to accept postsecondary study after completion of professional study in lieu of up to 30 semester hours of preprofessional study.

Dr. Mizani completed a five and one-half year professional dental education program at University of Bonn in Bonn, Germany. Therefore, he lacks one-half year (15 semester credits) of education, which is in the preprofessional area. Dr. Mizani also completed 18 semester credits through the completion of CLEP exams.

Additionally, an applicant who completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school must complete the required two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program, culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Dr. Mizani enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry program at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in December 2019. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

The Executive Secretary for the State Board for Dentistry recommends that the petitioner's combination of studies be accepted as fulfilling the required preprofessional and professional education for licensure.

RECOMMENDATION: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Dentistry, recommends that the applicant's preprofessional and professional education requirements be considered fulfilled.

MEDICINE

Petition for: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

Summary Statement: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
