Issue for Decision (Consent)

A vacancy on the New York State Rehabilitation Council (SRC) for a representative from the Office for People With Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) has occurred. We are seeking the review and approval of the proposed appointment of Julia Kelly to the SRC by the Board of Regents.

Reason(s) for Consideration

The Federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) requires the Board of Regents to appoint members to the New York State Rehabilitation Council (SRC).

Proposed Handling

This issue will come before the Full Board for action at its March 2022 meeting.

Procedural History

As the vacancies on the SRC occur, the Board of Regents approves recommendations to fill such vacancies.
