SUMMARY

Issue for Decision

Should the Board of Regents approve a \$611,700 grant to The University of the State of New York Regents Research Fund from The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation?

Reason(s) for Consideration

Review of policy.

Proposed Handling

Background Information

The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation has awarded a \$611,700 grant to The University of the State of New York Regents Research Fund to strengthen the teaching of elementary mathematics and launch a new teacher recruitment system in New York State. The grant would support work in three areas:

• Set of Briefs. One or more consultants would be hired to develop a comprehensive set of briefs and presentations, including webinars, on effective, evidence-based practices for teaching math in the elementary grades.

The briefs would provide guidance for the P-12 and higher education communities about effectively teaching elementary math.

• **Model Partnership.** Through a competitive procurement process, a New York State institution of higher education (IHE) would receive funding to lead a model partnership between the IHE and a school district and/or BOCES that supports an elementary school or network of schools in teaching effective, evidencebased practices in math.

The IHE and school district/BOCES would collaboratively identify and review high-quality instructional materials (HQIM) for teaching math in the elementary grades that reflect the effective, evidence-based practices identified in the briefs described above. The IHE would also conduct professional development for the elementary teachers in the school(s) – as well as work with university supervisors, cooperating teachers, and candidates (triads) in clinical experiences (e.g., student teaching, residency) – on implementing effective, evidence-based practices in teaching math and HQIM with fidelity and rigor. Additionally, elementary teachers who engage in professional development; understand the effective, evidence-based practices for teaching math; and embrace implementing HQIM in their classrooms would be selected and supported to provide professional development for teachers and administrators in other schools, districts, and/or BOCES about their experiences with HQIM in their model school/network, serving as teacher "ambassadors."

• New Teacher Recruitment System. Some of the funds would be used to help pay for some of the first-year costs for <u>Teach.org</u> to develop and deploy a statecustomized, comprehensive recruitment system that is designed to increase the quantity and diversity of teachers in New York State. Their system, which is grounded in research, includes: a statewide marketing campaign to inspire New Yorkers to consider teaching and generate leads; programming, experiences, and inspirational content to cultivate leads; and one-on-one advising, guides to educator preparation programs and licensure, financial assistance, certification exam preparation, and other resources to support leads in overcoming common barriers to becoming a teacher.
