SUMMARY

Issue for Decision

Should the Board of Regents approve the proposed merger of **Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter School** (an education corporation authorized by the New York City Department of Education Chancellor), with and into **Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter School 2** (an education corporation authorized by the SUNY Board of Trustees), with **Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter School 2** as the surviving education corporation under the amended name "**Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter Schools**"?

Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by State statute.

Proposed Handling

This issue will come before the P-12 Education Committee and recommendation to the Full Board for action at its March 2024 meeting.

Procedural History

The May 2010 amendments to Education Law §2853(1)(b-1) eliminated language that prohibited education corporations in New York from operating more than one charter school, and now allows charter schools and the families they serve to realize the many potential benefits of governance and operational merger.

The Chancellor of the New York City Department of Education made the revision recommendation being presented to the Board of Regents for approval as required by Article 56 of the Education Law.

Background Information

The merger of existing charter school governing boards requires revisions to each of the charters of the merging schools, which must be approved by the respective chartering entity or entities involved. This means that, in situations where schools that wish to merge have different chartering entities, the approval of all parties – the boards of trustees of the schools and each chartering entity – is required before any such merger may occur.

Mergers have no impact on the number of charters available under the statutory charter cap. Mergers are generally administrative/governance related revisions. The merger does not abridge the obligations of each of the applicable charter schools from meeting all authorizer standards and each school continues to be held accountable to such standards separately.

Recommendation

The Chancellor of the New York City Department of Education recommends that the Board of Regents take the following action(s):

VOTED: That pursuant to the authority contained in Education Law §§223 and 2853(1)(b-1)

 Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter School be and hereby is merged with Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter School 2, with Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter School 2 as the surviving education corporation under the amended name "Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter Schools."

- 2. **Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter School 2**, the surviving corporation, shall continue to administer the educational operations and purposes of the constituent corporations in the same manner as they presently exist.
- 3. The separate existence of Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter School and Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter School 2 hereby ceases, and Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter School 2, the surviving corporation under the amended name Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter Schools is hereby vested with all the rights, privileges, immunities, powers and authority possessed by or granted by law to each of the constituent corporations. All assets and liabilities of the respective constituent corporations are hereby assets and liabilities of such surviving corporation. All property, real, personal and mixed and all debts to each of the corporations on whatever account are hereby attached to Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter School 2, the surviving corporation under the amended name Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter Schools, and may be enforced against it to the same extent as if the debts, liabilities and duties had been incurred or contracted by it.
- 4. The merged corporation shall operate under the provisional charter granted to Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter School 2 under the amended name Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter Schools, which is hereby amended to authorize the operation of two public charter schools as follows:
 - i. Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter School; and
 - ii. Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter School 2
- 5. The merger herein shall take effect July 1, 2024; and it is further

VOTED: That the Board of Regents finds that: (1) **Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter Schools** meets the requirements set out in Article 56 of the Education Law, and all other applicable laws, rules and regulations; (2) **Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter Schools** can demonstrate the ability to operate in an educationally and fiscally sound manner; (3) granting the request to revise the charter is likely to improve student learning and achievement and materially further the purposes set out in subdivision two of Section twenty-eight hundred fifty of Article 56 of the Education Law; and (4) granting the request to revise the charter would have a significant educational benefit to the students expected to attend the schools operated by **Bedford Stuyvesant New Beginnings Charter Schools**, and the Board of Regents therefore approves the charter revision and amends the provisional charter accordingly.

<u>Timetable for Implementation</u>

The Regents action for the above-named charter school(s) will become effective July 1, 2024.

Rationale for Revision Recommendation

In accordance with Education Law, Article 56, Sections 2851(4) and 2852(2), the New York City Department of Education (NYCDOE) recommends that the Board of Regents grant the revision described above in the **Issue for Decision** section, for the following reasons.

- The merger is expected to permit more efficient and complete sharing of programming, practices, and resources for the schools' students with disabilities (SWD) and the schools' McKinney-Vento, economically disadvantaged (ED), and English language learning (ELL) students.
- The merger is expected to produce additional efficiencies such as common governance and common oversight and handling of finances.
- The requested revision will have no bearing on the number of charters available for issuance in New York City or the State.

The Board of Regents granted an initial charter to BSNBCS in January 2010. BSNBCS commenced instruction in Fall 2010, initially serving 180 students in kindergarten through grade 3. BSNBCS's charter was subsequently renewed by the Board of Regents in 2015, 2018, and 2023. The charter school was granted a revision to serve grades 9-12 in 2023.

Figure 1: Elementary/Middle School Assessment Proficiency State and District Differentials Over Time Comparison to NYC CSD 16



Summary of Public Comment

The required public hearing was held by the New York City Department of Education on February 1, 2024. Twenty-four people attended the hearing, and twelve spoke. Twelve were in favor of the renewal. No one was opposed.
