Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

Background Information

There are 2 licensing petitions and 20 requests for the conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine for review and approval.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions regarding licensing petitions.

Timetable for Implementation

Approval of the Committee on the Professions' recommendations will be effective April 23, 2013.

<u>13-07-07</u> Ariel Londono Centereach, New York 11720

(Queens College, Flushing, New York, Bachelor of Arts in Accounting, May 2008)

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Ariel Londono, an applicant for licensure as a CPA, recently passed the four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, he exceeded the 18-month time conditioning period in which to complete the examination requirements.

Mr. Londono received conditional credit for passing the Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) section of the Examination in May 2011. Under the 18-month conditioning requirements, he needed to pass the remaining three sections by December 31, 2012 in order to retain credit for FAR.

Mr. Londono sat for and passed the Auditing and Attestation (AUD) section of the Examination in July 2011. He sat for and passed the Regulation (REG) section on his third attempt in July 2012. He sat for and failed Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) in April, August, and November 2012. He then passed BEC on his fourth attempt in January 2013, 12 days after he lost conditional credit for FAR.

Mr. Londono's ability to effectively prepare for and sit for the exam was compromised because of the impacts of Superstorm Sandy. He scheduled to sit for and passed BEC in January 2013, the next available testing window.

Based on the circumstances presented, and the fact that Mr. Londono did successfully complete the fourth section of the Examination in the next available testing window, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports his petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy, recommends that the applicant's petition for acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform CPA Examination be accepted.

OPTOMETRY

<u>13-02-56</u> Julie-Ann Beckwitt Ocala, Florida 34471

(Illinois College of Optometry, Chicago, Illinois, Doctor of Optometry, May 1983)

Petition for: Waiver of New York State practical examination requirement.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Dr. Beckwitt has not passed a satisfactory practical examination as required for licensure either by the endorsement or examination route. New York State accepts a passing score on Part III of the National Board of Examiners in Optometry (NBEO) examination to satisfy the practical examination requirement. The NBEO practical examination was not required when Dr. Beckwitt was first licensed in Florida in 1983, which instead required their own practical exam that Dr. Beckwitt passed.

Additionally, Dr. Beckwitt has documented approximately 7 years of licensed experience in Florida, preceded by over 17 years of reported private practice, also in Florida.

Based on Dr. Beckwitt's demonstration of clinical skills by passing Florida's exam and through her years of hands-on licensed practice, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Optometry recommends that the requirement for a satisfactory practical examination (NBEO Part III) be considered satisfied.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Optometry, recommends that the Part III practical examination be waived.

MEDICINE

<u>Petition for</u>: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

<u>Summary Statement</u>: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
