SUMMARY

### **Issue for Consent Agenda**

### Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by State Statute.

### **Proposed Handling**

This question will come before the full board at its April 4, 2017 meeting where it will be voted on and action taken.

### **Procedural History**

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

### **Background Information**

There are two licensing petitions and eleven requests for the conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine for review and approval.

## Recommendation

It is recommended that the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions regarding licensing petitions and degree conferrals.

### **CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANCY**

17-02-07 Niko Blakely

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

#### Statement of Problem:

Mr. Blakely is an applicant for licensure as a CPA and passed all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, he exceeded the 18-month conditioning requirements by two and one-half months.

Mr. Blakely passed the Regulation (REG) and Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) sections of the Examination in January and February 2015 respectively and needed to pass the remaining two sections by September 30, 2016. Mr. Blakely passed the Auditing and Attestation (AUD) section of the Examination in June 2016. Mr. Blakely passed the Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) section of the Examination in December 2016, two and one-half months outside of his conditioning period.

Mr. Blakely's ability to properly prepare for the Examination was impeded by his medical condition that occurred during the conditioning period. Based upon documentation provided by his physician who attended to him and his perseverance on the various sections of the Examination, despite his medical condition, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports his petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

# **MEDICINE**

17-18-60 Ernesto Santos Martin Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania (Universidad de Alcala, Alcala de Henares, Spain, Licenciado in Medicine and Surgery, July 1991)

Petition for: Endorsement of his medical license from Spain.

Statement of Problem: Commissioner's Regulations allow endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination. A license granted in a foreign country can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination, clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Representatives from the State Board for Medicine have reviewed the documentation submitted in support of Dr. Martin's application. The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Martin's Spanish training positions between 1993 and 1997 and, his non-ACGME accredited training position between 2010 to 2013 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania be accepted as the substantial equivalent of the three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training required for licensure.

Commissioner's Regulations allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses and diplomate certificates to fulfill the licensure, proficiency, and clinical competency requirements for licensure by endorsement. Dr. Santos Martin obtained his medical license in Spain in 1991. His Spanish license is active and in good standing. Dr. Santos Martin was received certification by the American Board of Radiology for Diagnostic Radiology in December 2013 and in Vascular and Interventional Radiology in May 2016.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Santos Martin's Spanish license be endorsed, that his dual specialty certifications be accepted to fulfill the proficiency examination and the clinical competency requirements for endorsement.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine, recommends that the applicant's qualifications be accepted to fulfill the requirements for licensure by endorsement.

## **MEDICINE**

<u>Petition for</u>: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

<u>Summary Statement</u>: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
