Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by State Statute.

Proposed Handling

This question will come before the full board at its May 2013 meeting where it will be voted on and action taken.

Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

Background Information

There are 6 licensing petitions and 35 requests for the conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine for review and approval.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions regarding licensing petitions.

Timetable for Implementation

Approval of the Committee on the Professions' recommendations will be effective May 21, 2013.

13-08-08 Joanie Hsu Flushing, New York 11354

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Joanie Hsu, an applicant for licensure as a CPA, recently passed the four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, she exceeded the 18-month time conditioning period in which to complete the examination requirements.

Ms. Hsu received conditional credit for passing the Regulation (REG) section of the Examination in April 2011 and the Auditing and Attestation (AUD) section in May 2011. Under the 18-month conditioning requirements, she needed to pass the remaining two sections by December 31, 2012 in order to retain credit for REG and AUD.

Ms. Hsu sat for and passed the Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) section on her second attempt in May 2012. She sat for and failed Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) in November 2011, April 2012, August 2012, and November 2012. She then passed FAR on her fifth attempt in January 2013, 19 days after she lost conditional credit for REG and AUD.

Ms. Hsu's ability to effectively prepare for and sit for the exam was compromised because of the impacts of Superstorm Sandy. She scheduled to sit for and passed FAR in January 2013, the next available testing window.

Based on the circumstances presented, and the fact that Ms. Hsu did successfully complete the fourth section of the Examination in the next available testing window, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports her petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

13-09-07 Juan Martinez Bronx, NY 10468

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Juan Martinez, an applicant for licensure as a CPA, recently passed the four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, he exceeded the 18-month time conditioning period in which to complete the examination requirements by four months.

Mr. Martinez received conditional credit for passing the Business Environment Concepts (BEC) section of the Examination in November 2010. Under the 18-month conditioning requirements, he needed to pass the remaining three sections by June 30, 2012 in order to retain credit for BEC.

Mr. Martinez sat for and passed the Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) section on his second attempt in January 2012. He passed the Regulation (REG) section in October 2011. Mr. Martinez sat for and failed the Auditing and Attestation (AUD) section of the exam twice before passing it in on his third attempt in October 2012, four months after he lost conditional credit for BEC.

Mr. Martinez's ability to effectively prepare for and sit for the exam was significantly compromised during a period of several months due to a documented motor vehicle accident and his subsequent recovery. Mr. Martinez did continue to sit for the AUD section of the exam during this period, but was not able to prepare or focus effectively enough to pass, due to the impacts of the accident.

Based on the documentation provided and Mr. Martinez's success on all four parts of the Examination, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports his petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

Statement of Problem: Dr. Gupta did not complete the two academic years of study required in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Such study is required for applicants completing a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school. However, she enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in July 2012. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in regulation.

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

Statement of Problem: Dr. Kashi did not complete the two academic years of study required in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Such study is required for applicants completing a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school. However, he enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in June 2012. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in regulation.

13-43-60 Jean-Frederic Colombel New York, New York 10029

(Universite Lille 2, Faculte de Medecine, Lille, France, State Diploma of Doctor of Medicine, July 1987)

Petition for: Endorsement of his medical license from France.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Commissioner's Regulations allow for endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and if the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination (USMLE). A license granted in a country outside the United States can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination (ECFMG), clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the documentation of foreign and unaccredited training submitted in support of Dr. Colombel's application. He recommends that Dr. Colombel's training in France and fellowships in Minnesota and New York be accepted as the substantial equivalent of the required three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training.

Commissioner's Regulations also allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses to fulfill the licensure requirements and diplomate certificates obtained on the basis of satisfying experience and examination requirements to fulfill the proficiency and clinical competency requirements for licensure by endorsement.

Dr. Colombel obtained his medical license in France in 1988. His license is active and in good standing. Dr. Colombel further obtained a certificate of special studies in Diseases of the Digestive System from the Ministere de l'Education Nationale in 1984, a Diplom d'Etudes Approfondies (DEA) in "Cell Biology and Function of Digestive Processes" from Universite Paris 7 in 1987, and a Diplome d'Habilitation a Diriger des Recherches (HDR) from Universite Lille 2 in 1997. Dr. Colombel has not attempted any part of the New York State proficiency or licensing examinations.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the additional qualifications presented by Dr. Colombel and recommends that his French license be endorsed and that his certificate of special studies be accepted to fulfill the

proficiency examination requirement. He further recommends that Dr. Colombel's DEA and HDR be considered to fulfill the clinical competency requirement for endorsement.

MEDICINE

13-44-60 Nicola Fabbri New York, New York 10021

(Universita degli Studi di Bologna, Facolta de Medicina e Chirugia, Bologna, Italy, Doctor of Medicine and Surgery, February 1988)

Petition for: Endorsement of his medical license from Italy.

Statement of Problem: Commissioner's Regulations allow for endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and if the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination (USMLE). A license granted in a country outside the United States can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination (ECFMG), clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Dr. Fabbri has taken and passed USMLE Step 1 and Step 2, and was issued a standard ECFMG Certificate in 1994. However, he has not attempted USMLE Step 3. He has completed one year and ten months of ACGME accredited Fellowships in Adult Reconstruction and Musculoskeletal Oncology at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the documentation of Dr. Fabbri's Residency in Orthopedic Surgery and Fellowship in Musculoskeletal Oncology in Italy and recommends that this experience be accepted as the substantial equivalent of the remaining one year and two months of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training required.

Commissioner's Regulations also allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses to fulfill the licensure requirements and diplomate certificates obtained on the basis of satisfying experience and examination requirements to fulfill the clinical competency requirement for licensure by endorsement.

Dr. Fabbri obtained his medical license in Italy in 1988. His license is active and in good standing. Dr. Fabbri further obtained his specialty diploma in Orthopedic Surgery from the Universita degli Studi di Bologna in 1993.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the additional qualifications presented by Dr. Fabbri and recommends that his Italian license

be endorsed and that his specialty diploma in Orthopedic Surgery be considered to fulfill the clinical competency requirement for endorsement.

<u>Petition for</u>: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

<u>Summary Statement</u>: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
