#### **Proposed Handling**

#### **Procedural History**

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

## **Background Information**

There are 10 licensing petitions and 48 requests for the conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine for review and approval.

# Recommendation

It is recommended that the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions regarding licensing petitions.

## CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANCY

14-03-07 Edan Amar Beverly Hills, California

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy (CPA) Examination.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Mr. Amar was licensed in California as a CPA on February 9, 2011. California issued Mr. Amar's CPA license under conditioning requirements for passing the CPA Examination that were different than New York's conditioning requirements. Since he has only been licensed since February 2011, Mr. Amar does not have the 4 years of post-licensure experience that are required to qualify for licensure by endorsement in NYS. Therefore, he must petition the Committee to accept his passing exam scores from California.

Mr. Amar sat for and passed the Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) section of the Examination in November 2008. He needed to pass the remaining three sections by June, 2010 in order to retain credit for the BEC section. He passed Auditing (AUD) in May 2009 and Regulation (REG) in May 2010, both within the 18-month conditioning period. However, he didn't pass the fourth section, Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR), until August 2010 (two months outside of the conditioning period).

The California Board of Accountancy generally requires that the four sections of the exam be passed within an 18-month period, similar to NYS. However, they approved an extension of the exam window in Mr. Amar's case because the testing site was closed due to inclement weather.

Based on the fact that California has accepted Mr. Amar's Examination scores outside of their standard 18-month conditioning period, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports his petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Regulations of the Commissioner require an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable pre-professional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of pre-professional and professional education.

Dr. Baranovsky completed a five-year combined pre-professional and professional dental education program at Lviv State Medical University named after Danylo Halytskyy in Lviv, Ukraine. Therefore, she lacks one year of education which is in the pre-professional area.

Dr. Baranovsky also completed a one-year Community Dentistry Fellowship from June 2010 through May 2011 at University of Rochester Eastman Institute for Oral Health, in Rochester, New York. The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Dentistry recommends that these studies be considered to fulfill the remaining one year of required pre-professional education.

Additionally, an applicant must complete the required two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Such study is required for applicants completing a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school.

Dr. Baranovsky enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in June 2013. <u>Statement of Problem</u>: Regulations of the Commissioner require an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable pre-professional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of pre-professional and professional education.

Dr. Bordonaba-Leiva completed a five-year combined pre-professional and professional dental education program at Universitat Internacional de Catalunya, St. Cugat del Valles, Spain. Therefore, he lacks one year of education which is in the pre-professional area.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: An applicant for licensure in dentistry who has completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school is required to complete two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school.

Following dental school in Iran, Dr. Chhibber completed a two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry (AEGD) program from July 2010 through June 2012 at the University of Connecticut, School of Dental Medicine. The AEGD program offered by the University of Connecticut is accredited by the American Dental Association.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Dentistry recommends that Dr. Chhibber's completion of the two year AEGD program at University of Connecticut, School of Dental Medicine be considered as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: An applicant for licensure in dentistry who has completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school is required to complete two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school.

Following dental school in Iran, Dr. Khataie completed a two-year qualifying program in Dentistry from April 2004 to June 2006 at the University of Toronto, Faculty of Dentistry, Toronto, Ontario, Canada. According to a statement from Toronto University Faculty of Dentistry, graduates of the qualifying program have demonstrated competency equivalent to that of graduates of University of Toronto's D.D.S. program, and are eligible for licensure in Canada. The University of Toronto's D.D.S. program is accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of Canada.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Dentistry recommends that Dr. Khataie's certificate of qualification from the University of Toronto, Faculty of Dentistry be considered as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

A license granted in a country outside the United States can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination (ECFMG), clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Commissioner's Regulations also allow for the acceptance of appropriate foreign medical licenses to fulfill the licensure requirements and diplomate certificates obtained on the basis of satisfying experience and examination requirements to fulfill the proficiency and clinical competency requirements for licensure by endorsement.

Dr. Michev has not attempted any part of the New York State proficiency or licensing examinations and does not have any ACGME accredited training.

In June 1998, Dr. Michev was certified to practice as a physician and surgeon in Italy. His certification is active and in good standing. Dr. Michev further obtained his Specialization Diploma in Cardiology from the Universita degli Studi di Milano in July 2002 with very high marks on the European Economic Community specialization examination in cardiology (which is required by Italian law in order to practice as a cardiologist).

The Acting Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed Dr. Michev's physician license application as well as related documentation and consulted with the Chairman of the New York State Board for Medicine. She recommends that Dr. Michev's certification to practice as a physician and surgeon in Italy be endorsed. She further recommends that Dr. Michev's postgraduate Specialization Diploma in Cardiology be considered to fulfill the clinical competency requirement for endorsement.

The Acting Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine also recommends that the sum of Dr. Michev's postgraduate hospital training in Italy be accepted to meet the requirements for postgraduate medical training. For four years of this training, Dr. Michev

successfully completed cardiology residency and fellowship programs approved by the European Union of Medical Specialists, an organization that accredits graduate medical programs in 35 European countries.

Finally, the Acting Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine believes that Dr. Michev's expertise and extensive contributions in the field of interventional cardiology should be considered to fulfill the proficiency requirement for endorsement. Dr. Michev is cited as an author in 90 cardiology related studies, which were published in prominent European and American medical journals. He served as a principle investigator for clinical trials of transcatheter mitral valve replacement technology, which was recently approved by the FDA for use in the United States. This new technology holds the promise of saving and improving the lives of thousands of New York residents. Dr. Michev is an expert in research and development of other structural heart devices as well. He has vast clinical experience in developing and implementing structural heart disease treatment protocols in Europe and Japan. He has trained and proctored other cardiologists and surgeons who provide new cardiac care treatments in Europe, Asia, South America, and the United States. Dr. Michev's expertise and experience training and supervising physicians who perform new, less invasive cardiac treatment is currently in great demand in New York.

<u>Petition for:</u> Endorsement of his medical license from Italy.

Statement of Problem: Commissioner's Regulations allow for endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and if the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination (USMLE). A license granted in a country outside the United States can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination (ECFMG), clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Commissioner's Regulations also allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses to fulfill the licensure requirements and diplomate certificates obtained on the basis of satisfying experience and examination requirements to fulfill the clinical competency requirement for licensure by endorsement.

Dr. Sorgente has taken and passed USMLE Step 1 and Step 2, and was issued a standard ECFMG Certificate in December 2012. However, he has not attempted USMLE Step 3. Dr. Sorgente also does not have any ACGME accredited training.

In September 2000, Dr. Sorgente was certified to practice as a physician and surgeon in Italy. His certification is active and in good standing. Dr. Sorgente further obtained his postgraduate Diploma of Specialization in Cardiology from the Universita degli Studi di Bari in October 2004.

The Acting Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed Dr. Sorgente's physician license application as well as related documentation. She recommends that Dr. Sorgente's certification to practice as a physician and surgeon in Italy be endorsed. She further recommends that Dr. Sorgente's Diploma of Specialization in Cardiology be considered to fulfill the clinical competency requirement for endorsement.

The Acting Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine also recommends that his five year Residency in Cardiology in Italy and Fellowship in Clinical Cardiac Electrophysiology in Belgium be accepted to meet the requirements for postgraduate medical training.
