SUMMARY

Issue for Consent Agenda

Proposed Handling

Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

Background Information

There is one licensing petition and eighteen requests for the conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine for review and approval.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions regarding licensing petitions and degree conferrals.

Timetable for Implementation

Approval of the Committee on the Professions' recommendations will be effective May 8, 2018.

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Mr. Rafferty, an applicant for licensure as a CPA, recently passed the four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, the applicant exceeded the 18-month conditioning requirement by two weeks.

Mr. Rafferty passed the Auditing and Attestation (AUD) section of the Examination in January 2016 and needed to pass the three remaining sections by September 30, 2017 to retain credit for AUD. Within the 18-month conditioning period, the applicant passed the Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) section on the first attempt in July 2016 and passed the Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) section in July 2017 on his first attempt since his 18-month conditioning period began. The applicant passed the Regulation (REG) section of the Examination on the first attempt in October 2017, approximately two weeks after he lost conditional credit for the AUD section.

Mr. Rafferty scheduled and attempted to sit for the REG section on September 10, 2017, which was within his 18-month conditioning period. However, the testing center was closed due to Hurricane Irma. Mr. Rafferty rescheduled, sat and passed the REG section on October 16, 2017, the next testing window, however this was two weeks outside of the 18-month conditioning period.

Based on documentation from the National Association of State Boards of Accountancy (NASBA) that it was beyond the applicant's control that he could not sit for the REG section in September 2017, before he lost credit for AUD; the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports his petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy, recommends that the applicant's petition for acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform CPA Examination be accepted.

MEDICINE

<u>Petition for</u>: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

<u>Summary Statement</u>: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
