SUMMARY

Issue for Decision (Consent)

Should the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions pertaining to licensing petitions and degree conferrals as listed on the attachment?

Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

Background Information

There are four licensing petitions and fifteen requests for the conferral of the degree of Doctor of Medicine for review and determination.

<u>24-02-79</u> Nathalia Paiva de Andrade Buffalo, New York

(University of Sao Paulo, Sao Paolo, Brazil, Cirurgiao-Dentista, July 2012)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Section 6604-b of Article 133 of the Education Law requires an applicant for restricted dental faculty license to have completed a total of no less than six academic years of preprofessional and professional education, including: courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics; and not less than four academic years of professional dental education satisfactory to the department.

Immediately after secondary school, Dr. Paiva de Andrade completed a four and onehalf year professional dental education program at University of Sao Paulo in Sao Paolo, Brazil. Following that, she completed a two-year master's degree and a two-year Doctoral degree, in Stomatology and Pathology: Basics and Applied and in Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology and Special Care Patients, respectively, also at University of Sao Paulo in Sao Paolo, Brazil.

Although Dr. Paiva de Andrade has more than six years of combined education in dentistry, her education does not exhibit the pattern of two years of preprofessional education followed by a four-year dental program as expected. The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Dentistry recommends that Dr. Paiva de Andrade's combination of studies be accepted to fulfill the education requirement.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Dentistry, recommends that the applicant's education requirements be considered fulfilled.

<u>24-47-60</u> Eva Morava-Kozicz Rochester, Minnesota

(University of Pecs, Pecs, Hungary, Doctor of Medicine, September 1990)

Petition for: Endorsement of applicant's medical license from Hungary.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Commissioner's Regulations allow endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination. A license granted in a foreign country can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination, clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Dr. Morava-Kozicz presents acceptable postgraduate training and a diplomate certificate in satisfaction of the required experience pursuant to part 60.3.

Commissioner's Regulations allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses and diplomate certificates to fulfill the license, proficiency, and clinical competency requirements for New York State licensure by endorsement. Dr. Morava-Kozicz obtained her medical license in Hungary in 1991. Her Hungarian license is active and in good standing. Additionally, Dr. Morava-Kozicz holds Specializations in Infant and Child Medicine (November 1994) and Neonatology (May 1998) from the National Vocational Qualification Committee and a Specialization in Human Genetics (April 1999) from the Imre Haynal University of Health Sciences.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Morava-Kozicz's Hungarian license be endorsed, and her ECFMG Certification and Specializations be accepted to fulfill the proficiency examination and the clinical competency requirements for endorsement.

<u>24-48-60</u> Peter von Homeyer Muenster, Germany

(Freie Universitaet Berlin, Berlin, Germany, Arztliche Prufung, November 2001)

Petition for: Endorsement of applicant's medical license from Germany.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Commissioner's Regulations allow endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination. A license granted in a foreign country can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination, clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Dr. von Homeyer lacks three years of accredited postgraduate training. The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the documentation submitted in support of Dr. von Homeyer's application. He recommends that Dr. von Homeyer's training be accepted as the equivalent of the three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training required for licensure.

Commissioner's Regulations allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses and diplomate certificates to fulfill the license, proficiency, and clinical competency requirements for New York State licensure by endorsement. Dr. von Homeyer obtained his medical license in Germany in 2003. His German license is active and in good standing. Additionally, Dr. von Homeyer holds Specialist Titles in Anesthesiology, Emergency Medicine and Intensive Care medicine from the Westphalia-Lippe Medical Registration Board and a Diplomate certificate in Advanced Perioperative Transesophageal Echocardiography, issued by the National Board of Echocardiography.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. von Homeyer's German license be endorsed, and his Specialty titles and Diplomate certificate be accepted to fulfill the proficiency examination and the clinical competency requirements for endorsement.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine, recommends that the applicant's qualifications be accepted to fulfill the requirements for licensure by endorsement.

<u>24-49-60</u> Hidehiko Yoshimatsu Tokyo, Japan

(University of Tokyo, Tokyo, Japan, Bachelor of Medicine, March 2009)

Petition for: Endorsement of applicant's medical license from Japan.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Commissioner's Regulations allow endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination. A license granted in a foreign country can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination, clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Dr. Yoshimatsu lacks three years of accredited postgraduate training. The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the documentation submitted in support of Dr. Yoshimatsu's application. He recommends that Dr. Yoshimatsu's training be accepted as the equivalent of the three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training required for licensure.

Commissioner's Regulations allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses and diplomate certificates to fulfill the license, proficiency, and clinical competency requirements for New York State licensure by endorsement. Dr. Yoshimatsu obtained his medical license in Japan in 2009. His Japanese license is active and in good standing. Additionally, Dr. Yoshimatsu has a passing score of USMLE Step 1, a Doctor of Philosophy, and membership of Japan Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Hidehiko Yoshimatsu's Japan license be endorsed, and his USMLE Step 1, Doctor of Philosophy, and professional society membership be accepted to fulfill the proficiency examination and the clinical competency requirements for endorsement.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine, recommends that the applicant's qualifications be accepted to fulfill the requirements for licensure by endorsement.

<u>Petition for</u>: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

<u>Summary Statement</u>: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
