THE BOARD OF REGENTS

The Board of Regents of The University of the State of New York held a public session on Monday, May 20 at 2:00 p.m. pursuant to a call to duty sent to each Regent.

Chancellor Merryl H. Tisch called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. Regent Chapey welcomed attendees and gave opening remarks, along with Gail Mellow, President of LaGuardia Community College.

Bridget Quinn Carey, Chief Operating Officer of the Queens Library spoke to the Board on the impact of Hurricane Sandy on libraries and Sheena Wright, President, United Way of New York City described the United Way's recovery efforts.

Members of the Board of Regents shared their experiences from their visits to schools impacted by Hurricane Sandy.

Proposed Amendments to Section 52.21 and Part 80 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education and the Addition of a New Subpart 57-4 to the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education Relating to Coursework or Training in Harassment, Bullying and Discrimination Prevention and Intervention BR (CA) 3

MOVED, that section 52.21, Subpart 57-4 and Part 80 of the Commissioner's regulations be amended, as submitted, effective July 1, 2013.

The State University of New York Empire State College: Regents authorization to award the Master of Education (M.Ed.) Degree BR (CA) 4

MOVED, that the Board of Regents authorize the State University of New York Empire State College to confer the Master of Education degree on students successfully completing registered M.Ed. programs effective May 20, 2013.

P-12 Education

Amendment of Section 100.2(jj) of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education Relating to Dignity Act Coordinator and School Employee Training programs, to implement the Dignity for All Students Act

BR (CA) 5

MOVED, subdivision (jj) of section 100.2 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education be amended, as submitted, effective July 1, 2013.

Amendment of Section 200.18 of the Regulations of the Commissioner, relating to Municipal Audits of Education Law section 4410 Preschool Special Education Programs and Services BR (CA) 6

MOVED, that subdivision (b) of section 200.18 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education be amended, as submitted, effective May 28, 2013, as an emergency action upon a finding by the Board of Regents that such action is necessary for the preservation of the general welfare in order to timely establish, pursuant to statutory requirements consistent with section 24 of Chapter 57 of the Laws of 2013, standards and procedures for those municipalities, and the board of education of the city school district of the city of New York, that choose to perform fiscal audits of Education Law section 4410 preschool special education programs and services.

Emergency Adoption of Proposed Section 119.7 of the Regulations of the Commissioner, Relating to the Renewal of Charters of Charter Schools Authorized by the Board of Regents BR (CA) 7

MOVED, that section 119.7 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education be added, as submitted, as an emergency action effective June 10, 2013, upon a finding by the Board of Regents that such action is necessary for the preservation of the general welfare to ensure that the emergency rule adopted at the March 11-12, 2013, Regents meeting remains continuously in effect until the effective date of its permanent

adoption, and thereby avoid any potential disruption in the procedures for the renewal of charters of charter schools for which the Board of Regents is the charter entity.

Petition of the City School District of the City of Dunkirk for Consent to Exceed the Constitutional Debt Limit BR (CA) 8

MOVED, that the Board of Regents hereby gives consent to the issuance of bonds and/or bond anticipation notes by the Board of Education of the City School District of the City of Dunkirk in an amount not to exceed \$7,683,000 for capital improvements, consisting of reconstruction and renovations, in part and construction of, improvements to school buildings, grounds and facilities throughout the district and the issuance of such bonds and/or bond anticipation notes in excess of the constitutional debt limit of said school district.
