SUMMARY

Issue for Discussion

The New York State Summer School of the Arts (NYSSSA) completed its 2015 program year and looks forward to a successful 2016 program its 47th year of operation. NYSSSA's goal is clear: to provide intensive, pre-professional training programs for New York State's most gifted and motivated young artists, those who are considering careers in the arts or entertainment industries.

The committee will receive an update on the 2015 program from NYSSSA staff and NYSSSA School of Theatre Artistic Director, Margaret Denithorne as well as a NYSSSA School of Theatre 2014 Alumnus. The committee will also view a brief video about the program produced by Mountain Lake PBS.

Reason(s) for Consideration

Article 7 of the Arts and Cultural Affairs Law establishes the Summer School of the Arts within the Education Department. 2016 marks the 47th year of the program.

Background Information

NYSSSA operates seven month-long, residential programs for high-school students. Participation in these programs is based on a needs-blind audition or portfolio review conducted by artists. The seven schools and their host institutions are:

School of Ballet – Skidmore College, Saratoga Springs

School of Dance - Skidmore College, Saratoga Springs

School of Choral Studies - SUNY Fredonia, Fredonia

School of Media Arts – SUNY Oswego, Oswego

School of Theater - SUNY Delhi, Delhi

School of Visual Arts – SUNY Fredonia, Fredonia School of Orchestral Studies – Skidmore College, Saratoga Springs

Over 1200 students auditioned or submitted portfolios to participate in the seven NYSSSA schools in 2015. 406 students gained acceptance and enrolled in the program. NYSSSA continues to place a priority on making the program accessible to students who may not have the means to participate in a high-quality arts education program. Of the 406 students who attended NYSSSA in 2015, 32% of students received tuition assistance. 11% of students were from households with incomes of less than \$35,000 per year.

NYSSSA encourages members of the board to visit and witness the departmental program many students have indicated to be a life changing experience.
