SUMMAR

Issue for Decision

Should the Regents approve the proposed revision to the charter of the following school authorized by the Board of Regents?

Buffalo Academy of Science Charter School

Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by State statute.

Proposed Handling

This issue will be before the Board of Regents P-12 Education Committee and the Full Board for action at the June 2017 Regents meeting.

Procedural History

The New York State Education Department made the revision recommendations being presented to the Board of Regents for approval and issuance as required by Article 56 of the Education Law.

Background Information

The Commissioner recommends that the Board of Regents amend the charters of the above listed charter school. Information about the revision request is provided below.

Proposed Revision Proposed Revi					

In January 2004, the Board of Regents approved and chartered the Buffalo Academy of Science Charter School ("BASCS" or the "School") in the Buffalo City School District. The School's educational program focuses on math and science.

The School's Trustees request that the Board of Regents approve a material revision to its charter to allow the school to add an elementary school program. This expansion would allow the school to accommodate younger siblings of currently enrolled students. Incorporating additional grades will enable the school to have a longer time with students; thereby, closing the achievement gap earlier. Additional grades will prepare students to transition smoothly into the program's middle and high school by fostering the tenants of established school culture, thereby increasing student opportunities for continued academic success.

In addition, the school reports that there is significant demand in the community, as follows:

- Parent and community surveys conducted over two years showed that above 90% of parents surveyed are either very likely or somewhat likely to enroll their child in proposed STEM-oriented K-6 Elementary Charter School and that there is a high demand for a STEM-oriented K-12 charter school.
- The school received nearly 600 applications for 174 available seats for 2016-17 school year.
- The school has received over 200 support letters for its extension plans from community members, parents, community organizations, STEM businesses and higher education, including support letters from County Executive Mark C. Poloncarz, Assemblymember Crystal Peoples-Stokes, the Buffalo Museum of Science and University of Buffalo School of Engineering.
- The Buffalo Market is undergoing major, progressive changes that bode well for its future residents and especially for those with STEM-related educations. Advanced manufacturing jobs, requiring highly skilled workers proficient in science, technology, engineering and math are going to be in higher demand due to largescale investments in the Buffalo-Niagara region.

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¹ The proposed increase in maximum authorized enrollment is a result of the school requesting to add kindergarten through grade 2 and increasing the section size for grades 5-8 to accommodate high demand and the new elementary students as they move into the higher grades.

Summary of Public Comment

As required by the Charter School Act, the Buffalo Public Schools held a public hearing about the proposed revision to the charter of Buffalo Academy of Science Charter School on April 19, 2017. There were seven attendees present at the hearing, two from the charter school, three from the Buffalo Board of Education, and two Buffalo City School District staff members. There were no public comments made in support or in opposition to the proposed charter revision. Members of the Board of Education expressed concern about the numbers of students being returned to the district from charter schools.

Recommendation

VOTED: That the Board of Regents finds that: (1) the charter school meets the requirements set out in Article 56 of the Education Law, and all other applicable laws, rules and regulations; (2) the charter school can demonstrate the ability to operate in an educationally and fiscally sound manner; (3) granting the request to amend the charter is likely to improve student learning and achievement and materially further the purposes set out in subdivision two of section twenty-eight hundred fifty of Article 56 of the Education Law; and (4) granting the request to amend the charter will have a significant educational benefit to the students expected to attend the charter school, and the Board of Regents therefore approves the charter revision for **Buffalo Academy of Science Charter School** and amends the provisional charter accordingly.

Timetable for Implementation

The Regents action for Buffalo Academy of Science Charter School will become effective immediately.
