Background Information

On December 10, 2015, the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) was signed into law by President Obama. Subsequently, the United States Department of Education (USDE) is requiring that states develop new state accountability plans under ESSA. At the April and May Board of Regents meetings, the Board of Regents directed New York State Education Department staff and technical advisors to identify issues and opportunities associated with making changes to the state testing system to support the state's draft ESSA plan. At the June Board of Regents meeting, Scott Marion and Jennifer Dunn of the National Center for the Improvement of Educational Assessment will lead a discussion regarding possible approaches to implementing a revised system of State assessments.
