## **Issue for Decision (Consent Agenda)**

Should the Board of Regents approve appointments to the State Professional Standards and Practices Board for Teaching?

# Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by State regulation

# **Proposed Handling**

This question will come before the full Board at its July 2013 meeting where it will be voted on and action taken.

#### **Procedural History**

Terms for members of the State Professional Standards and Practices Board for Teaching are set forth in Regents Rule 3.14. The Board of Regents appoints members to four-year terms, with the exception of the teacher education student member, who is appointed to a two-year term. Board co-chairs are appointed for two-year terms.

## Recommendations

It is recommended that the Board of Regents approve the following four appointments to the State Professional Standards and Practices Board for Teaching: Stephen Danna (higher education member) to complete the term beginning July 1, 2013 and ending June 30, 2017; Michael Rosenberg (higher education member) to complete the term beginning July 1, 2013 and ending June 30, 2017; Colleen MacDonald (teacher member) to complete the term beginning July 1, 2013 and ending June 30, 2017; and Lloyd Jaeger moving from an administrator member to a public member, to complete the term beginning on July 1, 2012 and ending on June 30, 2016.

A brief biographical sketch of these recommended members and a list of the current membership are attached.

# <u>Timetable for Implementation</u>

Members' terms will begin immediately upon appointment.

Colleen MacDonald Membership Category: Teacher English Teacher/Grant Writer/Professional Developer Cambridge Central School District Cambridge, New York

Colleen McDonald is a native of New York, educated in New York State public school system from kindergarten through graduation. She then continued in NY with her undergraduate and master's degrees from the College of St. Rose. During her 29-year NYS career, Colleen has worked as a special education teacher with BOCES and as both a special educator and an English teacher in a small rural public school in upstate New York. At one point, Colleen moved into administration as Director of Pupil Services but was drawn, by the desire to interact more directly with students, back to the classroom. After, teaching in a middle school inclusionary special education model, Colleen pursued National Board Certification in English Language Arts and moved into a new stage of her career as a middle school and high school English teacher where she has served as a classroom teacher, department chairperson, and professional developer.

Colleen currently teaches both middle school and high school level English courses, directs the Cambridge Central summer school program, writes competitive grants for the district, and works with the Greater Capital Region Teacher Center on projects related to professional development around the implementation of both the APPR and CCLS.

Stephen Danna Dean, Queensbury Campus SUNY Plattsburgh Queensbury, New York **Membership Category: Higher Education** 

Dr. Stephen Danna is Dean of the SUNY Plattsburgh at Queensbury Branch Campus. He has 25 years experience in teaching and administration, and prior to that, worked with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and U.S. Naval Oceanographic Office as an oceanographer. A middle school guest lecture at a school assembly in Bay St. Louis, MS., led him to discover a hidden passion for education. A year later, he was teaching physics and chemistry to high school students in Glens Falls, N.Y. A native of Long Island, Dr. Danna earned his Bachelor's Degree in Biology in 1980 at Maryville College, Maryville, TN., and his Master's in Oceanography in 1982 from Old Dominion University, Norfolk, VA. He earned a Certificate of Advanced Study in Educational Administration from SUNY Plattsburgh in 1997 and another CAS in Brain Research in Education in 2006 from the University of Washington. Dr. Danna received his Ed.D. in Education Leadership in 2011 from Sage Graduate School, Albany.

Dr. Danna facilitated the North Country Support Group for teachers pursuing National Board certification, and co-founded the New Principals' Academy with Queensbury Central School District. Dr. Danna has received teaching fellowships from Princeton University, University of Wisconsin-Madison, and Drew University, and was honored in

1997 with the National Science Teachers Association's Exemplary High School Science Teaching Award. He maintains an active blog on education and leadership topics (<a href="http://racetothetopdannas.wordpress.com">http://racetothetopdannas.wordpress.com</a>), and has published papers with the National Staff Development Council, National Science Teachers Association, Journal of School Leadership, and Phi Delta Kappan.

Michael S. Rosenberg was appointed as the new dean of the School of Education at the State University of New York at New Paltz, effective Aug. 3, 2012.

As the Dean of the School of Education at New Paltz, Rosenberg serves as the chief academic and administrative officer for the School. His responsibilities include mentoring department chairs; recruiting and developing new faculty; supporting and initiating regional partnerships; and coordinating with faculty to promote innovative programs responsive to the needs of the region and to the State University of New York (SUNY). Rosenberg also manages financial resources and external fundraising; oversees accreditation procedures; and implements SUNY and State Education Department policies.

Rosenberg previously served as the associate dean for research in the School of Education and a professor in the Department of Special Education at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, Md. Prior to his 26 years at Johns Hopkins (11 as department chair), Rosenberg was an assistant professor for four years at Ball State University in Muncie, Ind., and also a visiting scholar at Westminster College in Oxford, England. Prior to his return to graduate study, Rosenberg taught secondary students with learning and behavior disorders for the Orleans-Niagara Board of Cooperative Educational Services in New York.

Rosenberg is the co-editor of Teacher Education and Special Education, the journal of the Teacher Education Division of the Council for Exceptional Children. He also co-authored five textbooks on various topics in special education. Rosenberg has authored or co-authored more than 60 articles and chapters, and served as a field editor for a number of special education journals.

Rosenberg completed a term as president of the Higher Education Consortium for Special Education and has served as research committee chair, publications chair, and secretary for the Council for Learning Disabilities. He was the first president of the Maryland Council for Learning Disabilities and completed a term as PTA president for Rodgers Forge Elementary School. He has advised over 30 doctoral graduates and was a recipient of the 2007 Teacher Education Division of the Council for Exceptional Children/Merrill Teacher of Excellence Award.

Rosenberg holds both his master's and bachelor's degrees in special education from the State University College at Buffalo (Buffalo State). He earned his Ph.D. in special education at Pennsylvania State University, and was recently a Fulbright Fellow at Saint Patrick's College in Dublin, Ireland.

Lloyd Jaeger Membership Category: Public Superintendent Millbrook Central School District (retired) Millbrook, New York

Lloyd Jaeger recently retired from the role of superintendent in the Millbrook Central School District, which he had held since July 2006. Previously, he served as deputy superintendent for K-12 Curriculum and Instruction in the Wappingers Central School District. His other district leadership experience spans over twenty years as assistant superintendent for instruction and deputy superintendent of schools in the Beacon City School District, assistant to the district superintendent for Dutchess County BOCES, and assistant superintendent for instruction and superintendent of schools in the Hyde Park Central School District. He has also served as an adjunct professor in educational technology at C.W. Post Campus of Long Island University and in educational administration at SUC New Paltz. Dr. Jaeger was also director of an educational consulting firm. Dr. Jaeger began his educational career as a social studies teacher and department chair at Suffern High School in the Ramapo Central School District, and his school administrator career as an assistant principal at F. D. Roosevelt High School in Hyde Park.

Dr. Jaeger is and has been an active member of numerous community, state and professional boards of directors including the National Urban Alliance, the Greater Southern Dutchess Chamber of Commerce, the Chamber Foundation, and the Dutchess Arts Council. He has been a consultant/advisor to the State Education Department, the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development, the Hudson Valley Philharmonic, the New York State Arts Council, the Community Foundation of Dutchess County, and the Rockland and Mid-Hudson Teacher Centers. He received the Mid-Hudson School Study Council's Award for Excellence in Administration, the National PTA's Honorary Lifetime Membership for distinguished service to youth, the L.I.F.E. Award from Literacy Volunteers of America, and the first Dutchess County Executive Award for school district arts-in-education programming.

Dr. Jaeger has a B.A. in History from Amherst College; and an M.A. in Educational Administration, Ed.M. in Organizational Leadership, Curriculum, and Teaching, and Ed.D. from Teachers College of Columbia University.
