Issue for Consent Agenda

Should the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions pertaining to licensing petitions as listed on the attachment?

Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by State Statute.

Proposed Handling

This question will come before the full board at its July 18, 2017 meeting where it will be voted on and action taken.

Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

Background Information

There are three licensing petitions and 21 requests for the conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine for review and approval.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions regarding licensing petitions and degree conferrals.

ARCHITECTURE

17-02-04 Walter Dean Thomas Los Angeles, California

<u>Petition for</u>: Waiver of New York State requirements for licensing examination based on evidence that the requirements have been substantially met.

Statement of Problem: Education Law (E.L.) §6506(5) provides that in supervising the admission to and practice of the professions, the Board of Regents may waive education, experience, and examination requirements for a professional license prescribed in the article relating to the profession, provided the Regents shall be satisfied that the requirements have been substantially met. The petitioner is a graduate of a professionally accredited architecture program who has applied for licensure in New York. He earned the professional Bachelor of Architecture degree in 1977 from the University of Texas at Austin. He has substantial documented licensed experience in other states.

Since 2009, in order to complete the examination requirements for licensure as an architect in New York, candidates must have passed the seven-division Architect Registration Examination (ARE). Between the years of 1983-2009, the ARE consisted of nine divisions. The petitioner took and passed eight of the nine divisions of the ARE. Prior to 1983, the exams were classified into two sections referred to as the Professional Examination (PE) and the Qualifying Test (QT). While the petitioner did pass Parts I and II of the PE (Environmental Analysis and Architectural Programming). He did not attempt the QT, Part A (Architectural Theory and History). The only remaining division he would have needed to have passed had he been a licensure candidate in New York was the Pre Design division of the ARE, Division A.

Given that the petitioner does not technically meet endorsement regulations as stipulated in regulation, an examination waiver of the single Pre-Design division of the ARE is sought. The petitioner satisfied the examination requirement in his initial state of licensure and has been licensed in Texas for the last 29 years. He has extensive professional practice satisfactory to the State Board, with over 25 years at Area Design Inc., the petitioner's company.

Since the above information illustrates evidence of competence within the profession and substantial equivalence of the required examination competencies and requirements, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Architecture recommends that the examination requirement be considered satisfied.

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: An applicant for licensure in dentistry who has completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school is required to complete two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school.

Dr. Pakhshan Ghaderi enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in June 2016. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: An applicant for licensure in dentistry who has completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school is required to complete two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school.

Dr. Sergio Varela Kellesarian enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in February 2017. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

<u>Petition for</u>: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

<u>Summary Statement</u>: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
