SUMMARY

Issue for Decision (Consent)

Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience, and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

Background Information

There are two licensing petitions and seven requests for the conferral of the degree of Doctor of Medicine for review and determination.

22-51-60 Rajesh Ahlawat Noida, India

(King George Medical University, University of Lucknow, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh, India, Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery, February 1978)

Petition for: Endorsement of his medical license from India.

Statement of Problem: Commissioner's Regulations allow endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination. A license granted in a foreign country can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination, clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the documentation submitted in support of Dr. Ahlawat's application. He recommends that Dr. Ahlawat's Indian training be accepted as the equivalent of the three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training required for licensure.

Commissioner's Regulations allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses and diplomate certificates to fulfill the license, proficiency, and clinical competency requirements for New York State licensure by endorsement. Dr. Ahlawat obtained his initial medical license in India in 1978 and registration by the Delhi Medical Council in 2000. His Indian license is active and in good standing. Additionally, Dr. Ahlawat was awarded a Master of General Surgery by King George's Medical College in January 1981, and a Master of Urology issued by All India Institute of Medical Science in March 1987.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Ahlawat's Indian license be endorsed, and his Master's Degrees be accepted to fulfill the proficiency examination and the clinical competency requirements for endorsement.

22-52-60 Rabih Bou Nassif New York, New York

(Saint Joseph University, Beirut, Lebanon, Doctor of Medicine, July 2009)

Petition for: Endorsement of his medical license from Lebanon.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Commissioner's Regulations allow endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination. A license granted in a foreign country can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination, clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the documentation submitted in support of Dr. Bou Nassif's application. He recommends that Dr. Bou Nassif's Lebanese training be accepted as the equivalent of the three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training required for licensure.

Commissioner's Regulations allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses and diplomate certificates to fulfill the license, proficiency, and clinical competency requirements for New York State licensure by endorsement. Dr. Bou Nassif obtained his medical license in Lebanon in 2009. His Lebanese license is active and in good standing. Additionally, Dr. Bou Nassif passed Colloquium Exams in General Medicine in July 2009 and became a specialist in General Medicine in 2009 and a specialist in Neurosurgery in 2016.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine recommends that Dr. Bou Nassif's Lebanese license be endorsed, and his exams and Specialist certificates be accepted to fulfill the proficiency examination and the clinical competency requirements for endorsement.

<u>Petition for</u>: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

<u>Summary Statement</u>: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
