Proposed Handling

Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

Background Information

There are 1 Pharmacy Supervisor Waiver, 9 licensing petitions, and 47 requests for the conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine for review and approval.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions regarding licensing petitions.

Timetable for Implementation

Approval of the Committee on the Professions' recommendations will be effective September 17, 2013.

PHARMACY

Yasser Alejo Steri-Pharma, LLC. 429 South West Street Syracuse, New York 13202

<u>Petition for</u>: Waiver of the requirement that a pharmacist or chemist supervise regulated activities for a registered manufacturer.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Mr. Alejo does not possess a bachelor's degree in chemistry. Commissioner's Regulations Section 63.6 (c) (1) requires a manufacturer to have a registered pharmacist present at all times when the establishment is open for business, except that a manufacturer may be under the supervision of a chemist who holds a bachelor's degree with a major in chemistry.

Mr. Alejo has both a Doctor of Medicine from the Higher Institute of Medical Sciences of Villa Clara, Republic of Cuba (1990-1995) and a Bachelor of Science in Biological Science from Rowan University (1997-1999). The former included courses in cellular and molecular biology (3 credits), histology (12 credits), pharmacology (7 credits), and biological agents (3 credits) and the latter included courses in biology (31 credits), chemistry (8 credits), and organic chemistry (8 credits) courses. The board office recommends the acceptance of the combined education in lieu of a bachelor degree in chemistry or pharmacy.

APPLICABLE REQUIREMENTS:	QUALIFICATIONS:
Education Law §6808.4 and Commissioner's Regulations § 63.6(c) (1): A manufacturer or wholesaler registered by the New York State Board of Pharmacy must have a pharmacist present during all business hours or be under the supervision of a chemist who holds a bachelor's degree with a major in chemistry and has at least two years of experience in manufacturing, repacking and/or wholesaling of drugs satisfactory to the New York State Board of Pharmacy.	 Higher Institute of Medical Sciences of Villa Clara, MD Degree, 1996. Rowan University, BS Biological Science, 1999, with 16 semester credits of Chemistry. Quality control manager at Steri- Pharma LLC from 2009 - Present. Senior Microbiologist at Hanford Pharmaceuticals from 1999-2009. Resume indicates a strong knowledge of good manufacturing process, quality control, United States Pharmacopeia (USP) and regulatory standards.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board of Pharmacy, recommends that Yasser Alejo be designated the supervisor of Steri-Pharma, LLC for the purpose of continuing operations.

REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSING

<u>13-02-22</u> Neringa Varanauskiene Parsippany, NJ 07054

Kaunas P. Mazylis Medical School, now Kauno Kolegija (Kaunas College), Kaunas, Lithuania, Medical Sister (Nurse) of Children's Institutions, July 1987.

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Section 6905 of New York State Education Law requires that applicants for nursing licensure in registered professional nursing must have received a diploma or degree in general nursing. Ms. Varanauskiene completed a two-year post-secondary professional nursing program leading to a diploma of Medical Sister (Nurse) of Children's Institutions at the Kaunas P. Mazylis Medical School in Kaunas, Lithuania in July 1987 (following passing of final state examinations). The diploma awarded then to graduates of the school's general nursing program was a qualification as Medical Sister which qualified the holder for general nursing practice in the former Soviet Union.

Ms. Varanauskiene asks that her education be accepted as satisfying the educational requirements for licensure. The applicant sent a copy of a December 2009 Lithuania state order which (per the translation) recognized persons with former Soviet Union diplomas as nurses for children's institutions or children's nurses earned up to May 25, 1999 as equal to general nurses and having the professional qualification in nursing of general practice.

The school sent a comparison of 1985 curriculums for Nursing and Nursing in Children's Institutions to the Bureau of Comparative Education and stated that the nursing in children's institutions major is equivalent to nursing and that the two programs were equivalent as "there are only slight differences in the number of hours."

Department staff have reviewed the specific courses for both programs and the applicant's course of study and have determined that her completed general nursing study in the children's nurse program is substantially the same as the general nursing program. Her nurse in children's institutions program required more total hours in pediatric courses such as children's diseases.

Based on this comprehensive review, staff recommend that her nursing education be considered equivalent to the general nursing education required in Commissioner's Regulations.

<u>13-08-50</u> Shaymaa Bakeer Dundalk, MD 21222

(Alexandria University, Faculty of Dentistry, Alexandria, Egypt, Bachelor of Dental Surgery, May 2001)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Regulations of the Commissioner require an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable pre-professional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of pre-professional and professional education. Dr. Bakeer completed a five-year combined pre-professional and professional dental education program at Alexandria University, Faculty of Dentistry, in Alexandria, Egypt. Therefore, she lacks one year of education which is in the pre-professional area.

Following dental school, Dr. Bakeer completed a Master's degree in Oral Surgery from September 2004 to June 2007 at Alexandria University, Faculty of Dentistry, in Alexandria, Egypt. Based on a review of Dr. Bakeer's advanced studies at Alexandria University, the Department staff recommends that these studies be considered to fulfill the remaining one year of required pre-professional education.

Additionally, Dr. Bakeer did not complete the two academic years of study required in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Such study is required for applicants completing a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school. She enrolled in the two-year advanced education in general dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in June 2012. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in regulation.

<u>13-09-50</u> Xiuli Sun Rochester, NY

(Norman Bethune University of Medical Sciences, Changchun, Jilin, People's Republic of China, Bachelor of Medicine in Stomatology, July 1997)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Regulations of the Commissioner require an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable pre-professional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of pre-professional and professional education. Dr. Sun completed a five-year combined pre-professional and professional dental education program at Norman Bethune University of Medical Sciences in Changchun, Jilin, People's Republic of China. Therefore, she lacks one year of education which is in the pre-professional area.

Following dental school, Dr. Sun completed a Master of Science in Biological Sciences from September 2002 through August 2005 at Ohio University in Athens, Ohio. Based on a review of Dr. Sun's advanced studies at Ohio University, the Department staff recommends that these studies be considered to fulfill the remaining one year of required pre-professional education.

Additionally, Dr. Sun did not complete the two academic years of study required in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Such study is required for applicants completing a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school. She enrolled in the two-year advanced education in general dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in February 2012. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in regulation.

<u>13-10-50</u> Hafiz-Muhammad-Moin Anwer Kearny, New Jersey 07032

(Lahore Medical and Dental College, University of Health Sciences, Lahore, Pakistan, Bachelor of Dental Surgery, January 2009)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Regulations of the Commissioner require an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable pre-professional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of pre-professional and professional education.

Dr. Anwer completed one year of pre-professional education, including the required courses, followed by a four-year professional dental education program at Lahore Medical and Dental College, University of Health Sciences in Lahore, Pakistan. Therefore, he lacks one year of education which is in the pre-professional area.

Following dental school, Dr. Anwer completed an additional one year of general dentistry training at Lahore Medical and Dental College, including lectures and clinical experience. The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Dentistry recommends that this additional training be considered to fulfill the remaining one year of required preprofessional education.

Dr. Anwer also did not complete the two academic years of study required in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Such study is required for applicants completing a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school.

However, Dr. Anwer has completed two years of study at Rutgers School of Dental Medicine in Newark, New Jersey as part of a combined Master of Dental Science and Orofacial Pain Fellowship. Based on a review of the program content, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Dentistry recommends that Dr. Anwer's two years of study at Rutgers School of Dental Medicine be considered as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

(Maulana Azad Medical College, University of Delhi, New Delhi, Delhi, India, Bachelor of Dental Surgery, September 2000)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Dr. Sharma did not complete the two academic years of study required in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Such study is required for applicants completing a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school. However, she enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in June 2012. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in regulation.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Dentistry, recommends that the applicant's professional education requirements be considered fulfilled.

PSYCHOLOGY

<u>13-01-68</u> Joel Wiesen Newton, MA 02459

(Lehigh University, Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, Ph.D., 1975)

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of an examination taken prior to its approval for use in New York State as the substantial equivalent of a satisfactory licensing examination.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Dr. Wiesen passed the Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology (EPPP) that was administered October 14, 1977, prior to the first administration of that examination in New York State in April 1978. The applicant has satisfied all requirements for the current licensing examination and is now eligible to take it. He is, however, requesting that his score on the October 1977 EPPP examination be accepted as meeting the examination requirement in New York State. While New York State has not established a passing score for that form of the examination, his score of 139 would have exceeded the score of 106 which has been determined by the Board for Psychology as acceptable for the October 1977 form of the EPPP. The minimum acceptable score is based on scores on forms of the EPPP that were administered between 1965 and 1977 and taken by persons also licensed in NYS at the time, and a review of the psychometric properties of the examination were found acceptable to the State Board and the Department.

Dr. Wiesen was licensed in Pennsylvania on December 1, 1977 and is currently licensed there. There was no derogatory information in the licensure files of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. He was licensed in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts on August 1, 1978 based upon reciprocity from Pennsylvania and is currently licensed there. The Department has no knowledge of any disciplinary action against him in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Psychology recommends acceptance of the applicant's request.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Psychology, recommends acceptance of the applicant's performance on the October 1977 EPPP examination as satisfying the examination requirement for licensure.

VETERINARY MEDICINE

<u>13-06-75</u> Mary Clare Rupley Northville, MI 48167

(Michigan State University, College of Veterinary Medicine, East Lansing, Michigan, D.V.M., 1979)

<u>Petition for</u>: Waiver of New York State requirements pertaining to acceptability of licensing examinations for licensure by endorsement.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Dr. Rupley graduated from an accredited college of veterinary medicine in 1979 and took the National Board (NBE) examination in that year. Dr. Rupley has not taken the Clinical Competency Test (CCT), which was offered only from 1979 to 2000. For New York State licensure, applicants who passed the NBE must also take the CCT. Both the NBE and the CCT have been replaced by the North American Veterinary Licensing Examination (NAVLE).

Dr. Rupley was licensed in Michigan based on the NBE and has documented more than 30 years of licensed practice.

In view of Dr. Rupley's documentation of numerous years of practice as evidence of clinical competence, the Acting Executive Secretary of the State Board for Veterinary Medicine recommends that the CCT examination requirement be waived and that the applicant's Michigan license be accepted for endorsement in New York State.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Acting Executive Secretary of the State Board for Veterinary Medicine, recommends waiver of the CCT examination requirement and endorsement of the applicant's Michigan license.

MEDICINE

<u>13-85-60</u> Stefania Asciutti New York, New York 10065

(Universita degli Studi di Perugia, Perugia, Italy, Diploma of Medicine and Surgery, October 2003)

Petition for: Endorsement of her medical license from Italy.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Commissioner's Regulations allow for endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and if the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination (USMLE). A license granted in a country outside the United States can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination (ECFMG), clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Dr. Asciutti has not attempted any part of the New York State proficiency or licensing examinations and does not have any ACGME accredited training.

The Interim Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed documentation of international and unaccredited advanced training submitted in support of Dr. Asciutti's application. She recommends that her over six years of postgraduate training in Italy and the US be accepted as the substantial equivalent of the required three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training.

Commissioner's Regulations also allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses to fulfill the licensure requirements and diplomate certificates obtained on the basis of satisfying experience and examination requirements to fulfill the proficiency and clinical competency requirements for licensure by endorsement.

Dr. Asciutti obtained her medical license in Italy in 2004. Her license is active and in good standing. She further obtained a specialty diploma in Gastroenterology in 2007 and a Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) in "Experimental Methods in Gastroenterological Surgery" in 2010, both from Universita degli Studi di Perugia.

The Interim Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the additional qualifications presented by Dr. Asciutti and recommends that her Italian license be endorsed and that her Ph.D. be accepted to meet the proficiency examination requirement. She further recommends that her specialty diploma be accepted to fulfill the clinical competency requirement for endorsement.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Commissioner's Regulations allow for endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and if the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination (USMLE). A license granted in a country outside the United States can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination (ECFMG), clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

Dr. Murali has not attempted any part of the New York State proficiency or licensing examinations and does not have any ACGME accredited training.

The Interim Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed documentation of international training submitted in support of Dr. Murali's application. She recommends that his over 8 years of residency training in Australia be accepted as the substantial equivalent of the required three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training.

Commissioner's Regulations also allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses to fulfill the licensure requirements and diplomate certificates obtained on the basis of satisfying experience and examination requirements to fulfill the proficiency and clinical competency requirements for licensure by endorsement.

Dr. Murali was registered as a medical practitioner in Australia in 1996. His registration is active and in good standing. He further obtained a Doctor of Medicine degree from the University of Sydney in 2011. He is also a Fellow of the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia since 2005.

The Interim Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the additional qualifications presented by Dr. Murali and recommends that his Australian license be endorsed and that his Doctor of Medicine degree and extensive residency experience be accepted to meet the proficiency examination requirement. She further recommends that his Fellowship with the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia be accepted to fulfill the clinical competency requirement for endorsement.
