Issue for Consent Agenda

Should the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions pertaining to licensing petitions as listed on the attachment?

Reason(s) for Consideration

Required by State Statute.

Proposed Handling

This question will come before the full board at its September 13, 2016 meeting where it will be voted on and action taken.

Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

Background Information

There are 7 licensing petitions and there are 26 requests for the conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine for review and approval.

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Recommendation

It is recommended that the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions regarding the licensing petition and the degree conferrals.

Timetable for Implementation

Approval of the Committee on the Professions' recommendations will be effective September 13, 2016.

<u>16-06-07</u> Joel Handler

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Mr. Handler is an applicant for licensure as a CPA and recently passed all four parts of the Uniform CPA examination. However, he exceeded the 18-month conditioning requirement by three and one-half months.

Pursuant to §70.4(d), applicants may sit for the CPA Examination prior to the Department's determination that the full education requirements for NYS Licensure have been satisfied. Mr. Handler gained entry to the Examination but his education has not yet been evaluated for the purpose of NYS Licensure.

Mr. Handler passed the Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) section of the Examination in February 2014 and needed to pass the remaining three sections of the Examination by September 30, 2015. On his first attempt and within the conditioning period, Mr. Handler passed Auditing and Attestation (AUD) in October 2014 and Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) in June 2015. Mr. Handler passed Regulation (REG) in January 2016, three and one-half months outside of his conditioning period.

Mr. Handler's ability to properly prepare and sit for the remaining sections of the Examination was impeded by his medical condition that occurred during the conditioning period. Based on documentation provided by his physician who attended to him and his perseverance on the various sections of the Examination, despite his medical condition, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports his petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

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<u>CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANCY</u> <u>16-07-07</u> Christopher Stuart

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Christopher Stuart, an applicant for licensure as a CPA, recently passed the four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, he exceeded the 18-month conditioning requirement by one and one-half months.

Pursuant to §70.4(d), applicants may sit for the CPA Examination prior to the Department's determination that the full education requirements for NYS Licensure have been satisfied. Mr. Stuart gained entry to the Examination but his education has not yet been evaluated for the purpose of NYS Licensure.

Mr. Stuart has a lengthy history with the CPA Examination and his ability to sit for the Examination has been negatively impacted by a number of hardware failures and administrative problems at the Examination site. He received conditional credit for the Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) section of the Examination in August 2014 and needed to pass the three remaining sections of the Examination by March 2016 to retain credit for FAR. He passed the Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) section in January 2015 and the Auditing and Attestation (AUD) section in November 2015, both within the 18-month conditioning period. Mr. Stuart sat for and failed the Regulation (REG) section of the Examination three times (August 2015, October 2015 and January 2016) before he passed the REG section of the Examination in May 2016, one and one-half months outside of the conditioning requirement.

While sitting for the REG section of the Examination in January 2016, Mr. Stuart experienced several administrative and technical failures that are the basis for a waiver by the Regents of the conditioning requirement. As a result of the administrative and technical difficulties that Mr. Stuart experienced during the January examination, the National Association of State Boards of Accountancy provided Mr. Stuart a free re-sitting of the REG section of the Examination. Mr. Stuart took and passed the REG section of the Examination in the next available quarter in May 2016.

Given the significant number of hardware and administrative failures that Mr. Stuart had to contend with and his perseverance with the exam despite these issues, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports his petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

<u>16-08-07</u> Moshe Drillman

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Mr. Drillman is an applicant for licensure as a CPA and recently passed all four parts of the Uniform CPA examination. However, he exceeded the 18-month conditioning requirement by two months.

Pursuant to §70.4(d) of Commissioner's Regulations, applicants may sit for the CPA Examination prior to satisfying the full education requirements for NYS Licensure. Mr. Drillman gained entry to the Examination, but his education has not yet been evaluated for the purpose of NYS Licensure.

Mr. Drillman passed the Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) of the exam in August 2014 and needed to pass the remaining three sections of the Examination by March 31, 2016. On his second attempt, he passed Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) in November 2015. On his fifth attempt, he passed Auditing and Attestation (AUD) in February 2016. Mr. Drillman passed AUD and BEC within the 18-month conditioning requirement. Mr. Drillman scheduled and sat for Regulation (REG) in January 2016, within his 18-month conditioning period, and he failed the exam. Mr. Drillman re-scheduled to sit for and passed REG in May 2016, during the next available testing window, two months, or one testing window outside of his conditioning period.

Mr. Drillman's ability to properly prepare and sit for the Examination was impeded by his parent's documented medical condition and by his role as a primary care-giver for his son with a medical condition during the conditioning period.

Based on documentation provided by him and his family's physicians who attended to Mr. Drillman's family, and his perseverance on the various sections of the Examination despite his circumstances, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports his petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

Statement of Problem:

Ms. Nassano is an applicant for licensure as a CPA and recently passed all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, she exceeded the 18-month conditioning requirements by two months.

Ms. Nassano passed, on her first attempt, the Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) section of the Examination in July 2014 and needed to pass the remaining three sections of the Examination by March 31, 2016. On her first attempt, Ms. Nassano passed Regulation (REG) in November 2014. Ms. Nassano passed Auditing and Attestation (AUD) on her third attempt in February 2016. Ms. Nassano scheduled and sat for Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) in January 2016 within her 18-month conditioning period, but she failed the Examination. Ms. Nassano re-scheduled to sit for and passed BEC in May 2016, during the next available testing window, two months, or one testing window outside of her conditioning period.

Pursuant to §70.4(d) of Commissioner's Regulations, applicants may sit for the CPA Examination prior to satisfying the full education requirements for NYS Licensure. Ms. Nassano gained entry to the Examination, but her education has not yet been evaluated for the purpose of NYS Licensure.

Ms. Nassano's ability to properly prepare and sit for the Examination was impeded by a death in her family; being a primary care giver for a family member with a serious medical condition that required Ms. Nassano's care; and her own medical condition that occurred during the conditioning period over two testing windows.

Based on documentation provided by her physician who attended to Ms. Nassano along with documentation of the death of her brother and medical condition of her father, and her perseverance on the various sections of the Examination, despite her circumstances, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports her petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

<u>Petition for</u>: Acceptance of passing grades on the Uniform Certified Public Accountancy Examination.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Ms. Patel is an applicant for licensure as a CPA and recently passed all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination. However, she exceeded the 18-month conditioning requirement by 19 days.

Pursuant to §70.4(d), applicants may sit for the CPA Examination prior to satisfying the full education requirements for NYS Licensure. Ms. Patel gained entry to the Examination, but her education has not yet been evaluated for the purpose of NYS Licensure.

Ms. Patel passed the Regulation (REG) section of the Examination in July 2014 and needed to pass the remaining three sections of the Examination by March 31, 2016. On her fourth attempt, she passed Financial Accounting and Reporting (FAR) in April 2016. Ms. Patel passed Auditing and Attestation (AUD) in October 2014 and Business Environment and Concepts (BEC) in January 2015. Ms. Patel scheduled and sat for FAR in May and November 2015 and February 2016, within her 18-month conditioning period, and she failed the Examination. Ms. Patel re-scheduled to sit for and passed FAR in March 2016, during the next available testing window, 19 days, or one testing window outside of her conditioning period.

Ms. Patel's ability to properly prepare and sit for the Examination was impeded by a death in her family, and her own medical condition that occurred during the conditioning period.

Based on documentation provided by her and her physician who attended to Ms. Patel and her perseverance on the various sections of the Examination, despite her circumstances, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Public Accountancy supports her petition to waive the 18-month requirement to pass all four parts of the Uniform CPA Examination.

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DENTISTRY 16-12-50 Sam Dirawi Rochester, NY

(Ukranian Medical Stomatological Academy, Poltava, Ukraine, Diploma in Dentistry, June 1998))

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Regulations of the Commissioner require an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable preprofessional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of preprofessional and professional education.

Dr. Dirawi completed a five-year combined preprofessional and professional dental education program at Ukranian Medical Stomatological Academy in Poltava, Ukraine. Therefore, he lacks one year of education which is in the preprofessional area.

However, Dr. Dirawi also completed four years of advanced study in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery November 1998 to November 2002 at O.O. Bogomolets National Medical University in Kiev, Ukraine. The Executive Secretary for the State Board for Dentistry recommends that these studies be considered to fulfill the one year of required preprofessional education.

Additionally, an applicant who completed a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school must complete the required two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program, culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Dr. Dirawi enrolled in the two-year Advanced Education in General Dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in December 2015. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Dentistry, recommends that the applicant's professional education requirements be considered fulfilled.

VETERINARY MEDICINE

<u>16-06-75</u> Barbara Grefe Delaney Brick, New Jersey

(University of Pennsylvania, School of Veterinary Medicine, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, V.M.D 1976)

<u>Petition for</u>: Waiver of New York State requirements pertaining to acceptability of licensing examinations for licensure by endorsement.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Dr. Delaney graduated from an accredited college of veterinary medicine in 1976 and took the National Board (NBE) examination in that year. Dr. Delaney has not taken the Clinical Competency Test (CCT), which was offered only from 1979 to 2000. For New York State licensure, applicants who passed the NBE must also take the CCT. Both the NBE and the CCT have been replaced by the North American Veterinary Licensing Examination (NAVLE).

Dr. Delaney was licensed in New Jersey based on the NBE in 1976.

In view of Dr. Delaney's documentation of nearly 40 years of practice as evidence of clinical competence, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Veterinary Medicine recommends that the CCT examination requirement be waived and that the applicant's New Jersey license be accepted for endorsement in New York State.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Veterinary Medicine, recommends waiver of the CCT examination requirement and endorsement of the applicant's New Jersey license.

MEDICINE

<u>Petition for</u>: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

<u>Summary Statement</u>: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
