

What's New in the 2024-2027 WIOA Combined State Plan

ACCES-VR

- Efforts to increase the state workforce of staff providing vocational rehabilitation services
- Conducted a Comprehensive Statewide Needs Assessment (CSNA) that evaluated ACCES-VR services and provided recommendations
- Improvements in the common performance measures
- Expansion of Pre-ETS to students with disabilities including partnerships with community colleges and Tribal Vocational Rehabilitation.

Adult Education

- Providing funding to 200 programs providing Adult Basic Education (ABE), Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education (IEL/CE) and Corrections and Literacy Zones (LZ) services.
- Increased services to Out of School Youth and adults receiving adult basic education, adult secondary education and ESL.
- Collaborated with Department of Labor to provide career exploration training to Regional Adult Education Network centers.
- Collaborated with GED to provide "Math Bootcamp" training to adult education teachers.
- Creation of a partnership with the USDOE Office of Career, Technical, and Adult Education (OCTAE) to provide literacy training to over 5,500 adult education teachers.
