Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)

WIOA Purpose

Align the workforce development system with education, training and economic development to respond to the labor market.

Draft 2020 WIOA Combined State Plan Implementation: Specific SED Strategies - Vocational Rehabilitation and Adult Education

Education/Training:

Develop integrated education and training models.
