



Cooperative CTE Work Experience Program*

 150 to 600 hours paid, school-supervised work experience; supported by related in-school instruction in specific CTE discipline

General Education Work Experience Program*

 Age 16 and above; 150 to 600 hours paid, schoolsupervised work experience supported by related in-school instruction in specific CTE discipline

CTE Cooperative Work Experience Program*

 Non-CTE students,150-600 hours paid, supervised work experience, supported by the equivalent of at least one classroom period per week of related instruction

Work Experience and Career Exploration Program*

 Similar in design and operation as the General Education Work Experience Program, but for atrisk students age 14-15




District A – Large Urban School District

- 4 would receive the proposed NYS CDOS Credential







District B - Big City School District
