Borrowing options based on patron preferences


- Braille

- Mailed or downloaded




Formats to Meet Individual Needs

No waitlists, no loan periods, new books added weekly


Download using a computer or device on an accessible platform

NYers with Visual and Physical Disabilities, 1,600,000


TBBL Readers, 33,000
