- Established by the Legislature in 1818.
- Collections contain more than 20 million items.
- Supports the research needs of state workforce and researchers around the world.
- Partnership between the National Library Service, the New York State Library, and US Postal Service.
- Provides braille and audio books by mail or digitally to any eligible New Yorker.

# School Library Systems Program

This state-aided program creates and funds 40 School Library Systems (SLS)

Based in the Big 5 Cities and the Boards of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES), which serve multiple districts in an area.

Main functions of the program are outlined in <u>Commissioner's Regulations 90.18</u>

## Reference and Research Regional Library Councils

Created in 1966 to expand the availability of the resources of academic, medical, law, business and special libraries to more New Yorkers and to enable libraries of all types to buy services and share resources cooperatively in order to strengthen programs and services.

Nine systems across the state, each governed by a board of trustees and has a variety of advisory committees to help carry out its work.

All nine of the reference and research library resources councils are supported by a combination of State Aid, membership dues and other revenue sources.

## Public Library Systems Program

23 public library systems support the sustainability and excellence of 758 public libraries (with more than 1,100 outlets) across the state.

Systems provide cooperative programs and services that help local communities take advantage of economies of scale.

# State Aid for Public Library Construction

- \$34 million in FY 23-24
   Partnership with DASNY
- Formula aid allocated to public library systems
- More than \$1.75 billion in statewide need
- Leverages local funding to make critical investments in library infrastructure
