State Archives Core Functions

- Preserve and make available the official records of New York Colony and State
- Provide records management oversight and assistance to state agencies
- Operate the State Records Center
- Provide records management oversight, grants, and technical assistance to local governments
- Support and provide funding for the work of non-government archives





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Use of the Archives Collection

The State Archives preserves and makes available 270 million items documenting New York's colonial and State governments.

In 2020, when our research room was closed to the public, we responded to 8,221 inquiries via e-mail and telephone.

We scanned 37,571 pages of material on-demand in 2020.

State Archives resources on Ancestry.com were accessed more than 5.8 million times in the first six months of 2021.

200,000 downloads from our online digital collections in 2021.

The State Archives acquires an average of 5,000 cubic feet of records annually, which most often are routine transfers from State Agencies.

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Local Government Archives and Records



Local governments are required to maintain their records:

- The Retention and Disposition Schedule for New York Local Government Records (LGS-1) provides authority for disposing of temporary records and identifying those that must be preserved.
- Local Government Records Management Improvement Fund (LGRMIF) Grants support the work of local governments to manage and preserve their records. \$270 million awarded since 1989.
- Five State Archives advisory staff provide hands-on assistance, training, and support statewide.



Documentary Heritage Program





Assists 4,000 repositories statewide

- Grants to improve access. 2020 projects included:
 - Out Alliance
 - St. Regis Mohawk Tribe
 - National Baseball Hall of Fame
 - Rochester Regional Health Medical Museum and Archives
- Training and assessment services through DHPSNY program
 - 157 assessments over 5 years
 - 1,202 participants in training in 2020
