


The New York State Historian position was created by an act of the Legislature in 1895 to "provide for the appointment of a State Historian and for the compilation of the military and naval records of the State."





### **Local Government Historians**



New York is one of only two states in the nation that require that all villages, towns, cities, counties and boroughs appoint a local historian.

All local government historians report to their municipalities and to the State Historian according to Cultural Affairs Law 57.07 and 57.09.




### **Museum Chartering**

Museums and historical societies with collections within New York State are required to charter as a private education corporation with The New York State Board of Regents. The Board of Regents also incorporates friends groups and other cultural agencies through a Regents certificate of incorporation. The State Historian provides program oversight for Museum Chartering.











#### **New York State 250th Commemoration Act**


- Passed the Legislature by <u>unanimous vote</u>.
- Governor Hochul signed into law February 24<sup>th</sup>, 2022.
- Creates a State Commission made up of 21 voting members. The Commissioner of SED and the Commissioner of OPRHP are co-chairs.
