OFFICE OF ACCESS, EQUITY, AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT SERVICES (OAECES)

NYSED's Office of Access, Equity, and Community Engagement Services (OAECES) administers approximately \$200 million in grants, contracts, and scholarships to colleges and universities; school districts and BOCES; community-based and non-profit organizations; and students.

These programs are designed to raise the skills, knowledge and opportunities of underrepresented, academically, and economically disadvantaged students.

POSTSECONDARY OPPORTUNITY PROGRAMS

- Arthur O. Eve Higher Education Opportunity Program (HEOP)




SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY ENTRY PROGRAM (STEP)

Created by the Legislature in 1986, the STEP program is designed to increase the number of historically underrepresented and economically disadvantaged students prepared to enter college, and improve their participation rate in mathematics, science, technology, health-related fields, and the licensed professions.

STEP programs are innovative **College-School District partnerships** that provide academic enrichment in science and mathematics content areas. Projects consist of academic year and summer components including:

- Enriched core science and math subject instruction
- Preparation for Regents exams and standardized tests
- Supervised practical and research training
- College/Career awareness/development activities






STEP ~ BY THE NUMBERS

During Academic Year 2021-22:

- 56 programs in New York State served 12,209 students
- 307 students participated in Internship activities totaling 24,601 hours
- I,134 students participated in Research totaling 54,532 hours



STEP graduates' main areas of college degree interest are as follows: Medical and Health Sciences, Engineering and Applied Sciences, and Life Sciences




COLLEGIATE SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY ENTRY PROGRAM (CSTEP)

Created by the Legislature in 1987, the program provides **postsecondary academic enrichment**, **mentoring**, **academic and career counseling**, **internships** and **research opportunities**, **standardized test preparation**, and **career activities**.

The program is designed to increase access for underrepresented and disadvantaged students to academic programs that prepare students either for licensure in the professions, or for employment in scientific and technical fields.






CSTEP ~ BY THE NUMBERS

During Academic Year 2021-22:

- 58 programs in New York State served 8,195 students
- I 37,943 student internship hours completed via 834 internship activities
- I69,362 student research hours completed via 1,112 research activities

4,602 or 56% of '21-'22 CSTEP participants were First-Generation Higher Education students.





LIBERTY PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM (LPP)

The Liberty Partnerships Program (LPP) was established in 1988 to address the elevated high school dropout rate among New York's youth. The program offers eligible students a comprehensive pre-collegiate, dropout prevention program that includes a variety of intervention activities and services that are tailored to meet the needs of each program participant and help prepare them for college and career.

- Individual, Group, Family Counseling
- Home Visits
- Mentoring
- College/Career Readiness
- Enrichment/Cultural Activity
- Service Learning/Community Service Projects

LPP ~ BY THE NUMBERS

- Over 15,000 students served
 - 5th-12th graders
- 46 projects statewide
 - LPP represented in each Judicial District
- 77% of LPP students are economically disadvantaged and 19% are students with disabilities
- 91.4% graduation rate in 2021-2022 including:
 - Over 90% of diplomas being a Regents designation






HIGHER EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM (HEOP)

In May 1969, the New York State Legislature passed an amendment to Education Law that expanded educational opportunity programs to independent institutions of higher education. The program provides a broad range of services to students who, because of educational and economic disadvantages, would otherwise be unable to attend a postsecondary educational institution.

- Intensive Pre-First Year Summer program for academic/campus orientation
- Structured mandatory counseling and tutoring throughout the entire academic career
 - Academic, Financial, Vocational, Social/Emotional Counseling
- Financial Support




- HEOP serves over 5,000

Bachelor's Degree Retention Rate






2021-22 HEOP RACE/ETHNICITY DISTRIBUTION






2021-22 PERCENTAGE OF HEOP STUDENTS RECEIVING COUNSELING SERVICES - BY TYPE OF SERVICE
