
Residency Programs and Certificate

Current

July 2017: Residency Certificate created for candidates enrolled in the Classroom Academy Residency Pilot Program.

Proposal

- Establish registration requirements for residency programs; and
- Candidates enrolled in a registered residency program are eligible for the Residency certificate.



Proposed Residency Definition



Residency means a structured, college-supervised learning experience for a candidate in a teacher education program that is designed and implemented through a memorandum of understanding, or similar collaborative agreement, between an institution of higher education and an educational setting. The partners design the residency to provide candidates with instructional experiences connected to program learning goals and district priorities, and develop shared expectations for the candidate's gradual assumption of responsibilities in their placement in the area of the certificate sought. Candidates complete pedagogical coursework during the residency and practice under the direct supervision of the certified school-based teacher.






TEST SCORES BY POPULATION AFTER ONE YEAR WITH RESIDENTS







 - May 2019 Search for additional funding sources



The *Classroom Academy* was approved and registered 22 Apprentices for September 2021.




