Special Education Teacher Shortage

There is a persistent shortage of special education teachers based on:

Teaching
Assignment
Data

Feedback from the Field

The shortage is particularly an issue at the secondary level and in special classes.

Students with Disabilities (SWD) Certificates

The Department is proposing to address the special education teacher shortage by creating a SWD (All Grades) certificate.

Current

Initial SWD certificates are issued in the following three grade bands:

- Birth-Grade 2
- Grades 1-6
- Grades 7-12

Proposal

Issue SWD certificates in the following two grade bands, after a transition period:

- Birth-Grade 2
- All Grades (PK-Grade 12)


Special Education Certification in Other States

The following table shows the special education certificate grade levels in 9 comparable (CA, FL, IL, TX) and surrounding (CT, MA, NJ, PA, VT) states.

Special Education Certificate Grade Levels	Out of 9 Comparator and Surrounding States

Elementary/Middle and Middle/Secondary	2


NYS Registered Students with Disabilities Programs

SWD (All Grades) Programs – Pedagogical Core Requirements

SWD (All Grades)
Certificate –Tests

Candidates would need to pass the following three certification tests that are currently required for SWD certificates:

Educating All Students (EAS) Test

Students with Disabilities CST

Multi-Subject Test (Options)

Subject Area Extension for Special Education Teachers

The Department is also proposing to revise the subject area extension for special education teachers in grades 5-9 or grades 7-12, which can be used to teach a special class.

Current

18 semester hours in the subject area AND

passing the Content Specialty Test in the subject area

Proposal

12 semester hours in the subject area

OR

passing the Content Specialty Test in the subject area

Implementation Timeline

Date	Activity
Effective date of the proposal	Individuals could apply for a SWD (All Grades) certificate, and the Department could begin registering programs leading to this certificate.
October 1, 2022	The Department would no longer register new programs leading to the current SWD (Grades 1-6) and SWD (Grades 7-12) certificates.
September 1, 2023	Candidates could apply for the current SWD (Grades 1-6) and SWD (Grades 7-12) certificates through the individual evaluation pathway prior to this date.

Implementation Timeline Continued

Date	Activity
September 1, 2024	By this date or at the time a new program is registered, whichever occurs first, the pedagogical core in SWD (Birth-Grade 2) programs must include developing comprehensive knowledge, understanding, and skills for teaching students with disabilities who are culturally and linguistically diverse.
September 1, 2029	Current SWD (Grades 1-6) and SWD (Grades 7-12) programs would no longer be registered with the Department.
September 1, 2030	The Department would no longer issue current SWD (Grades 1-6) and SWD (Grades 7-12) certificates with an effective date that begins after September 1, 2030, with the exception of the Professional certificate and reissuance of an Initial certificate.
