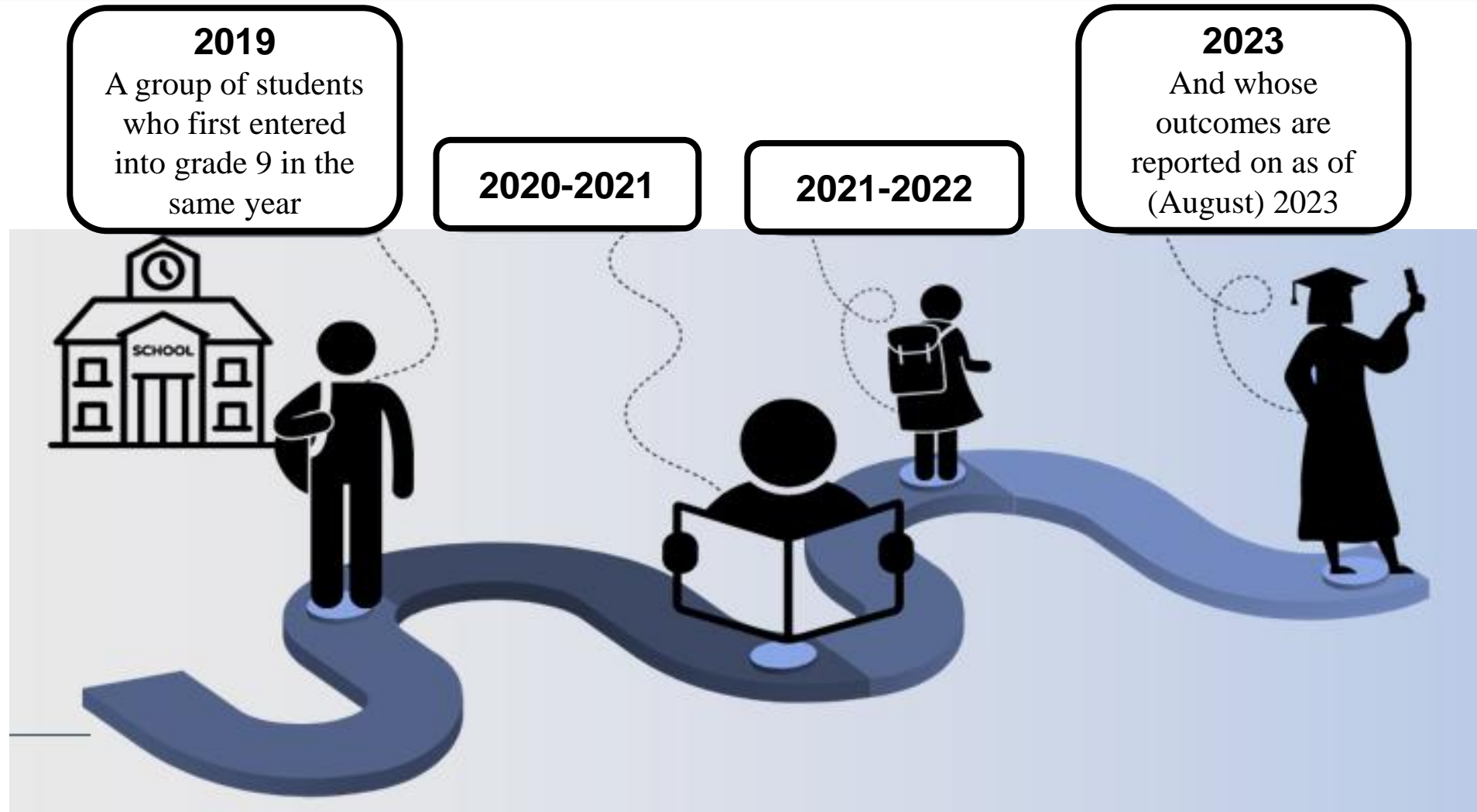

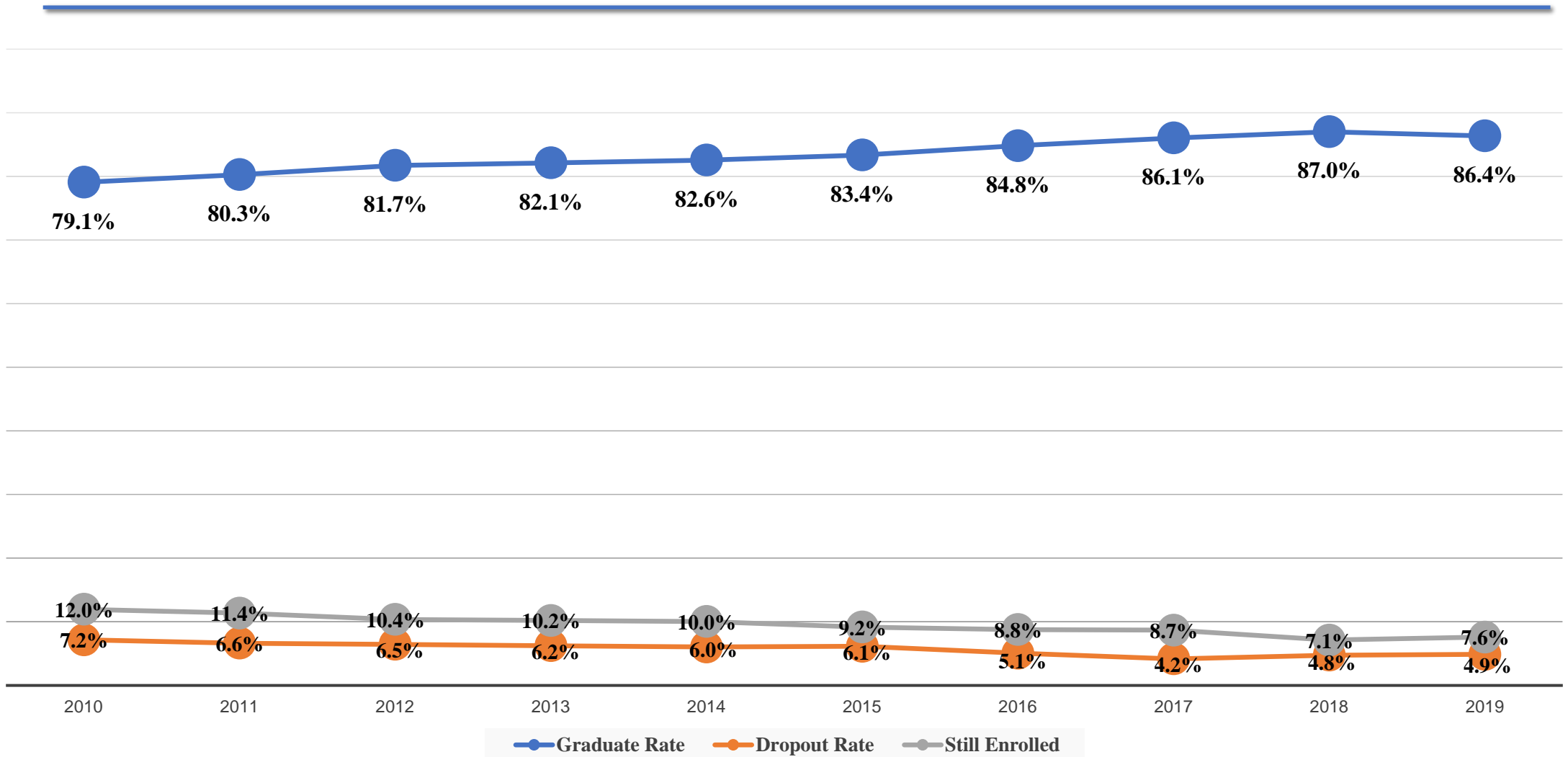


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Definition of the 2019 High School Cohort

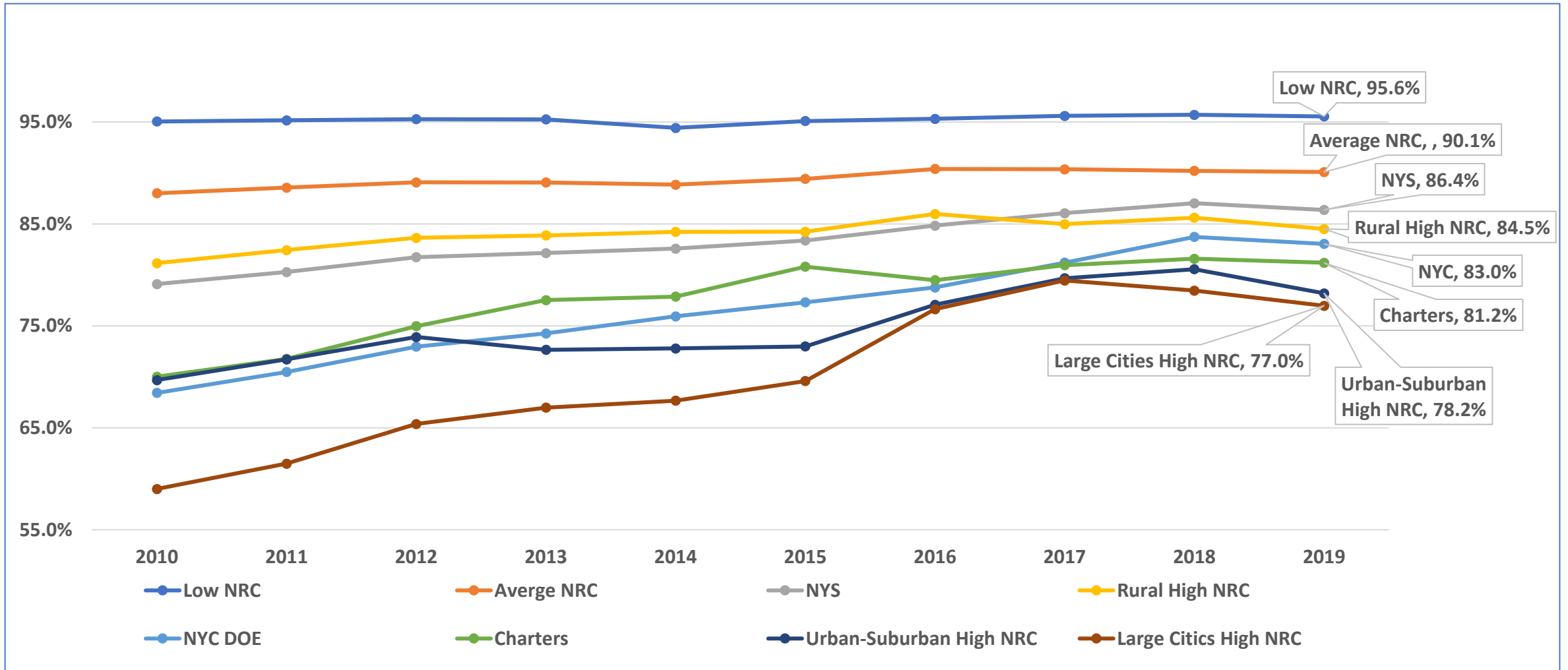

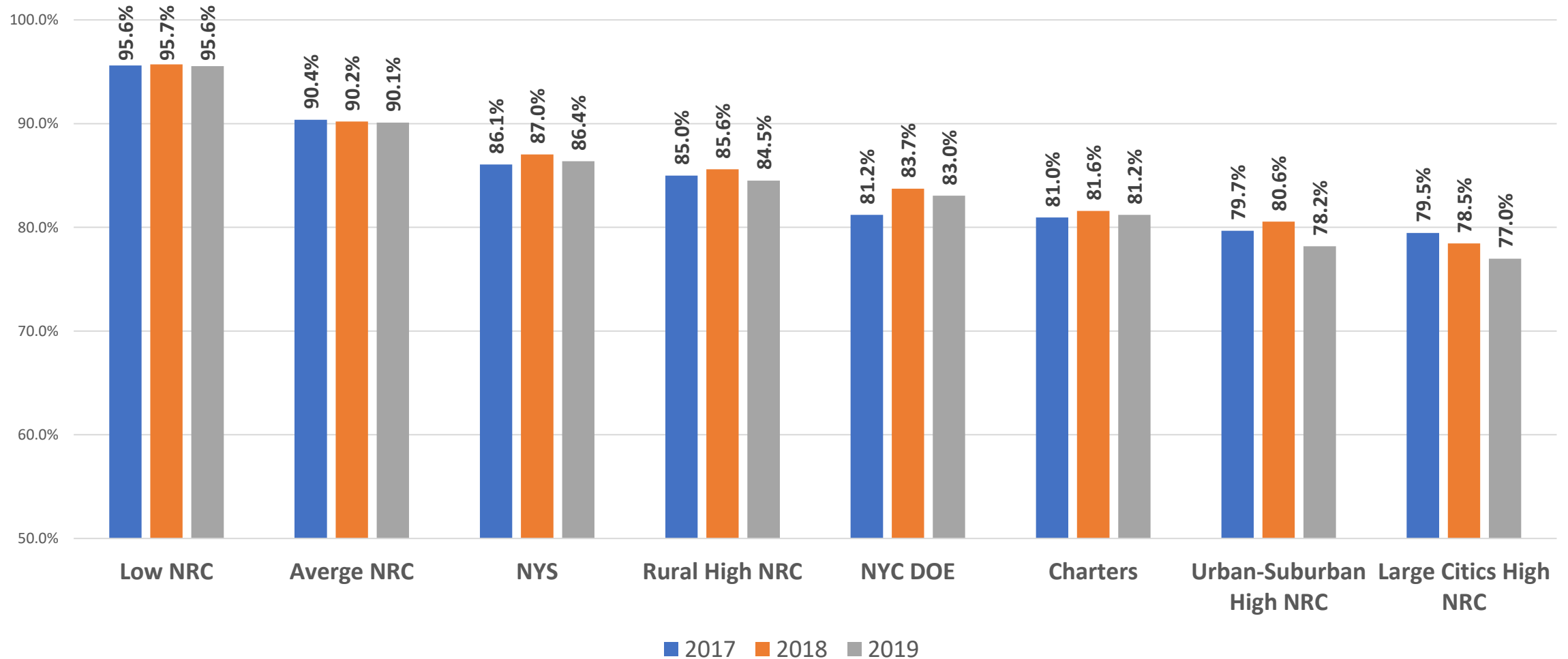


Graduation Rates by Need/Resource Capacity Category

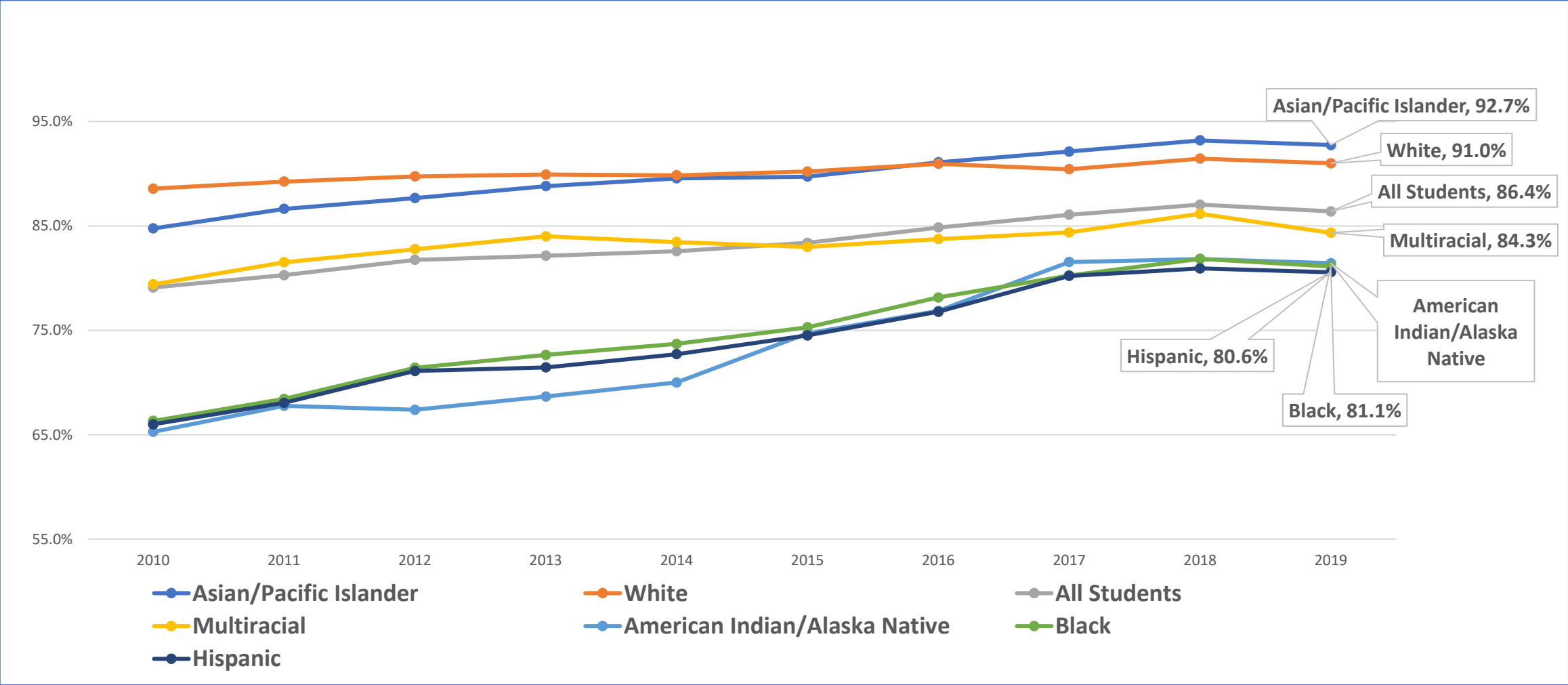


Graduation Rates by Need/Resource Capacity Category

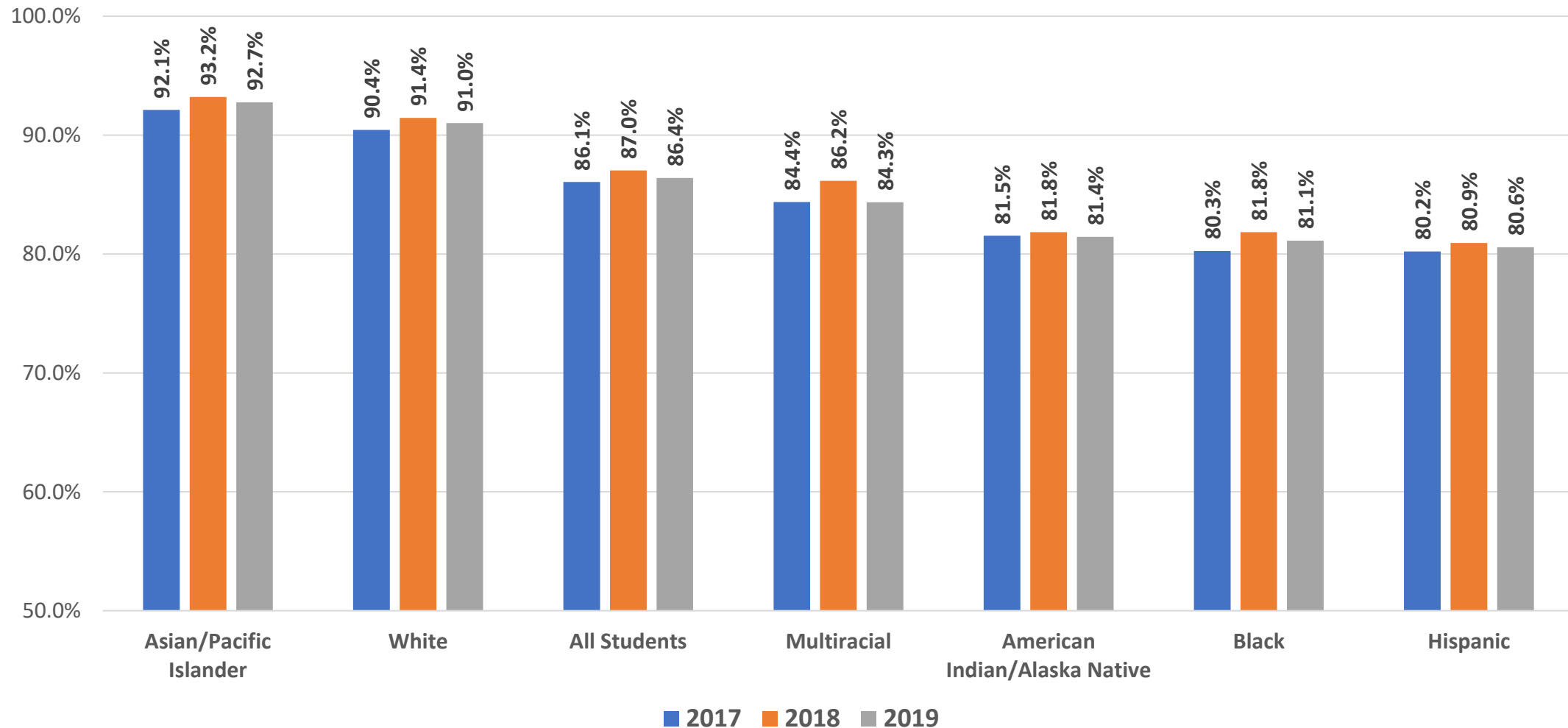


Graduation Rates by Race/Ethnicity

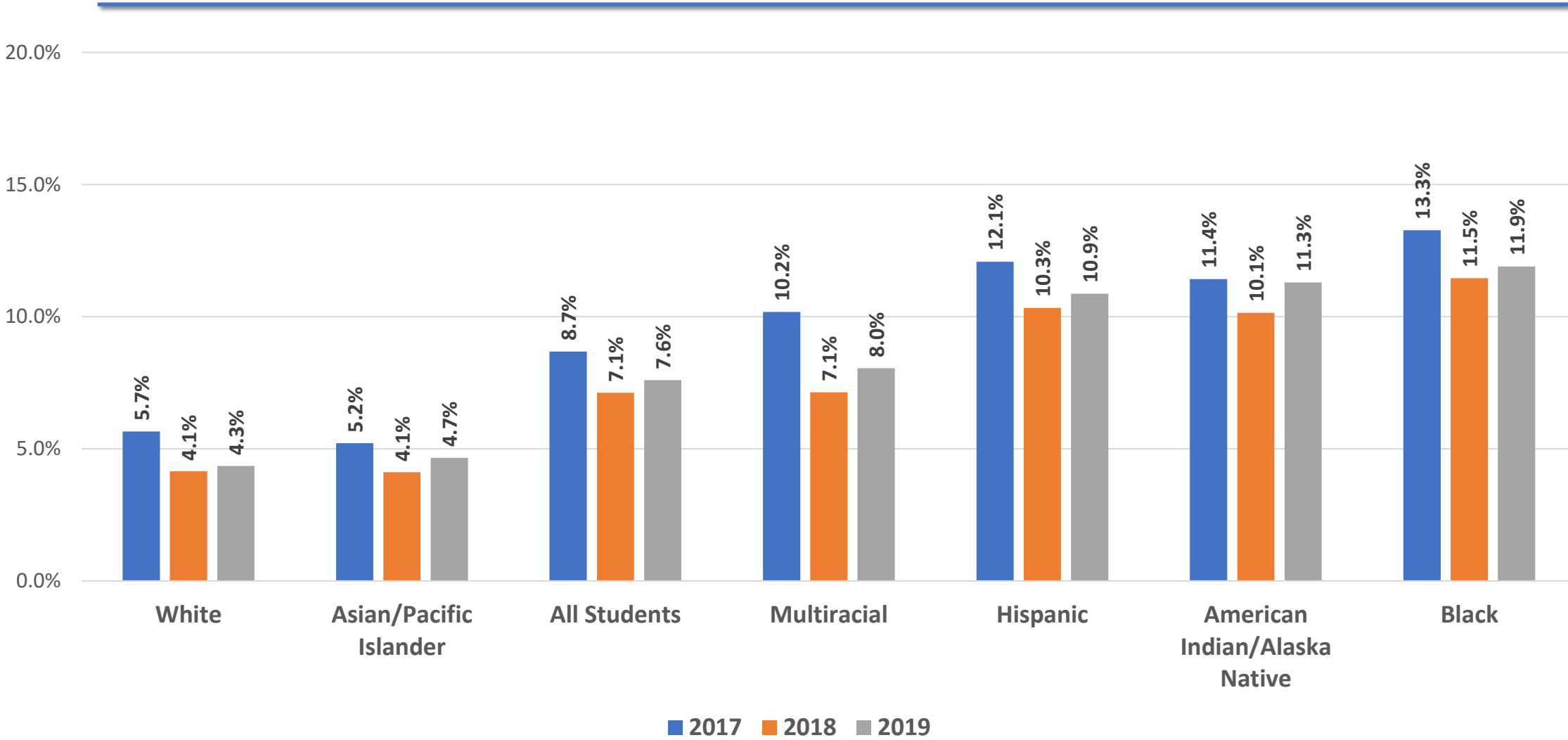

Percentage of Students Still Enrolled After 4 Years by Race/Ethnicity—Recent Three Cohorts

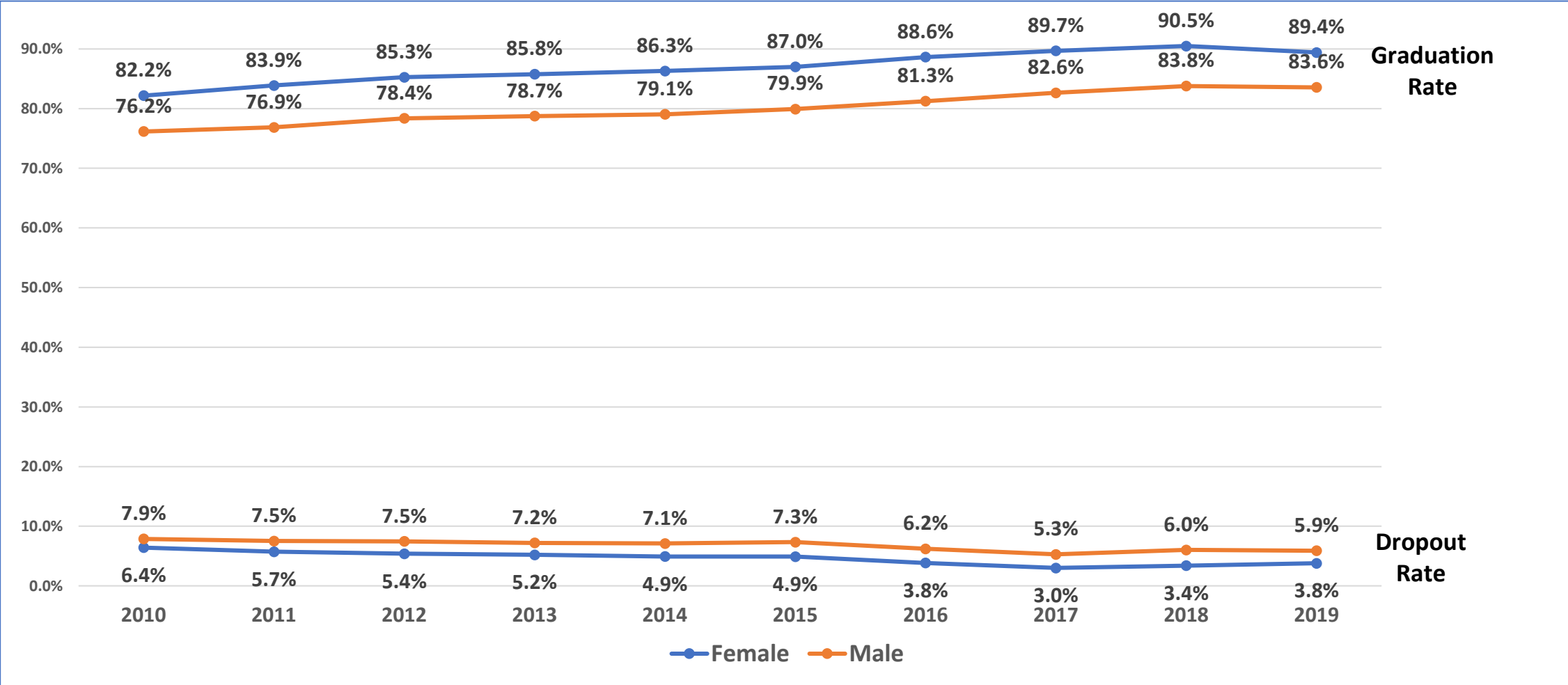

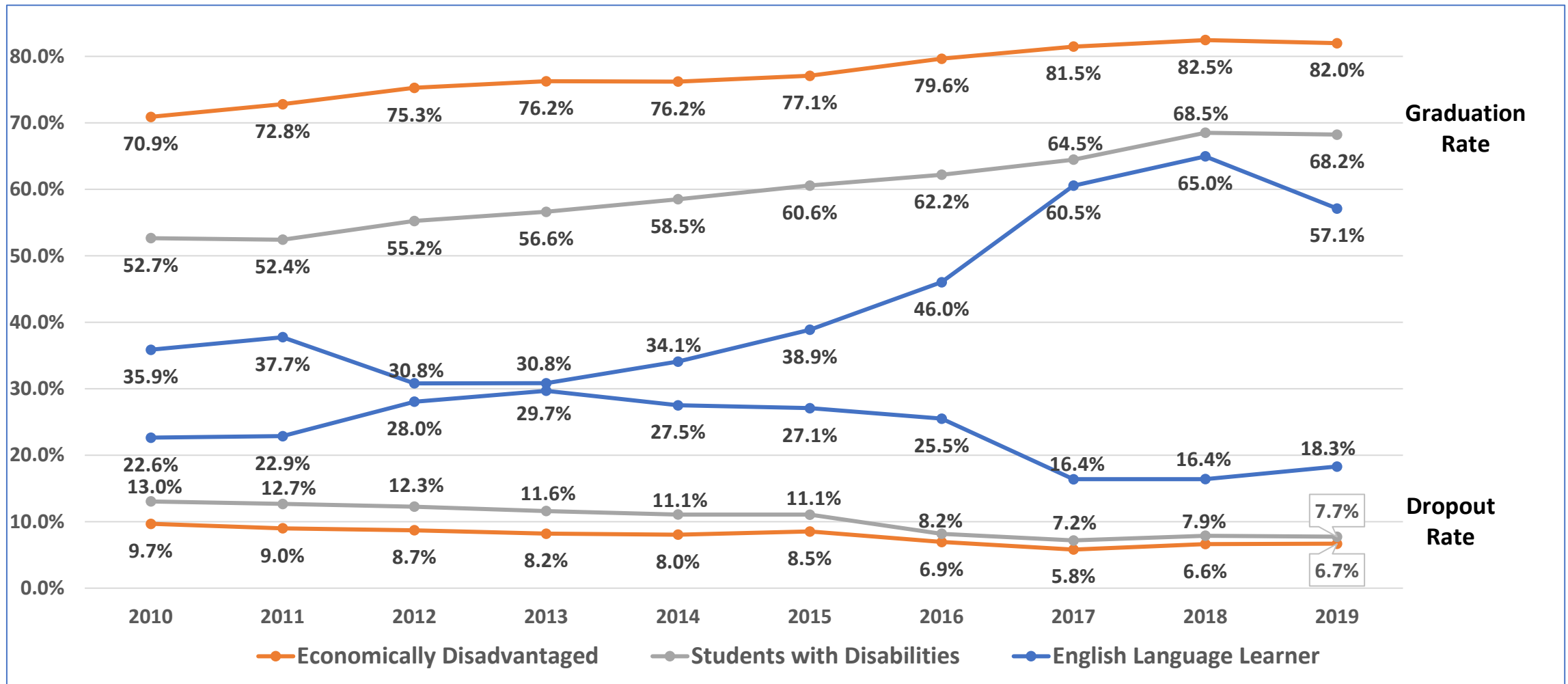

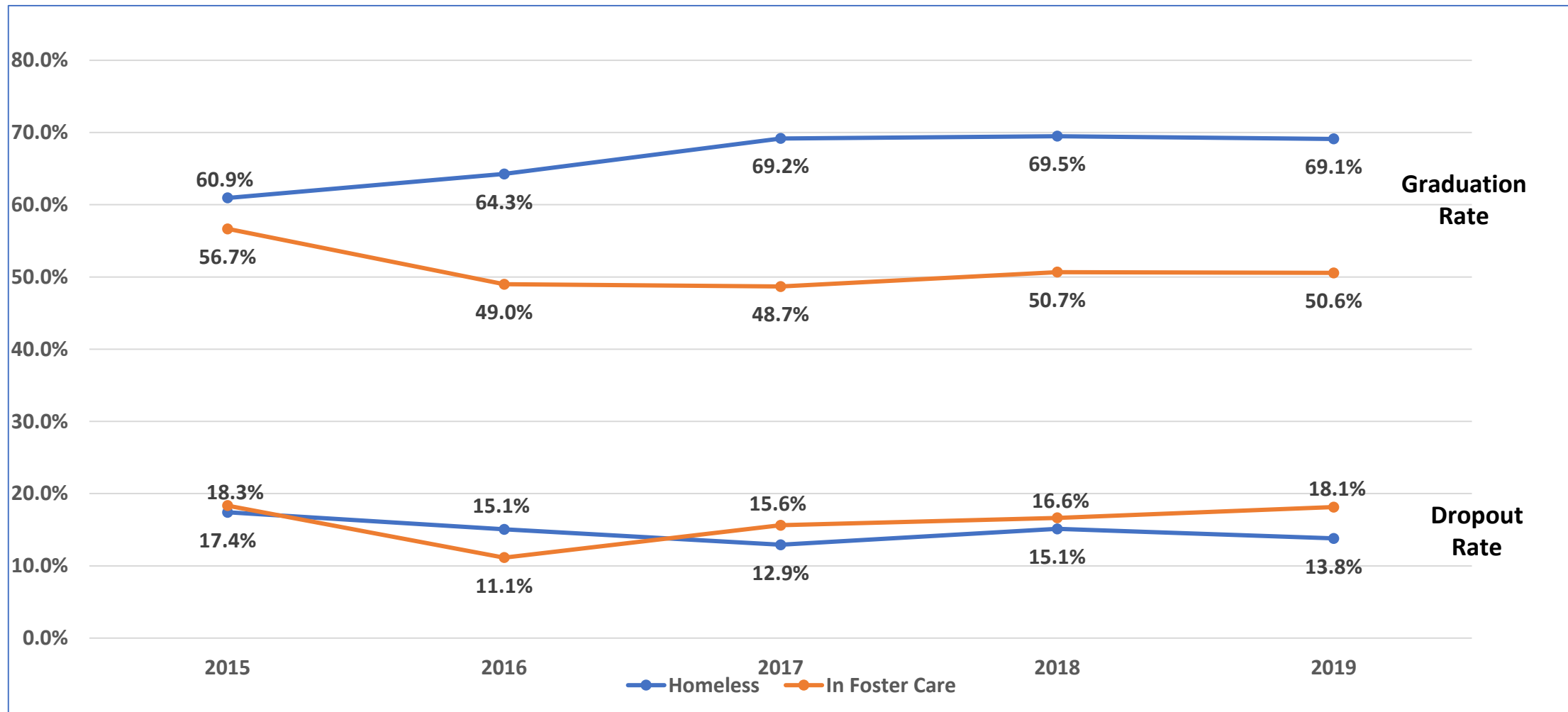
10-Year Trend of Graduation & Dropout Rates



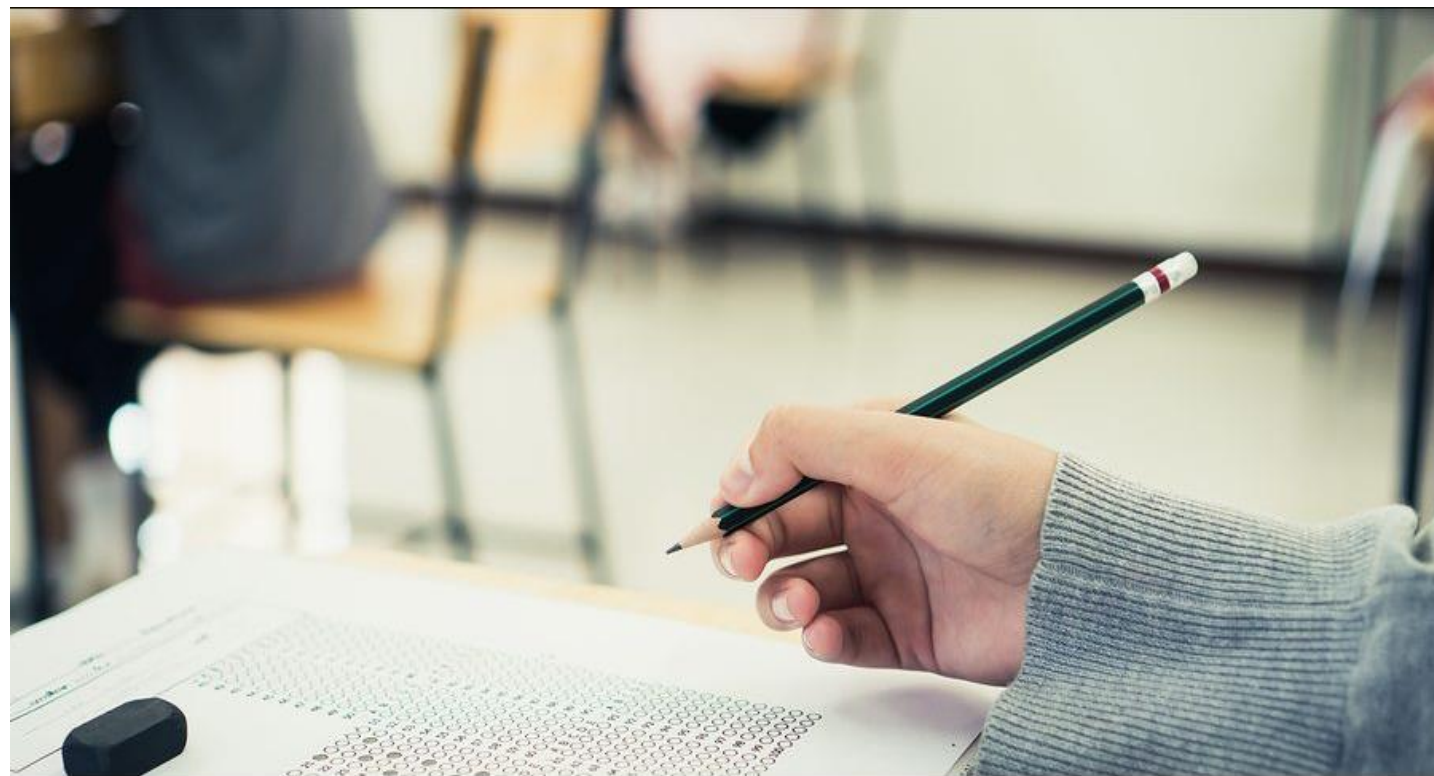
Economically Disadvantaged Students, Students with Disabilities, & English Language Learners: 10-Year Trend of Graduation & Dropout Rates

Impact of Regents Examination Exemptions



Regents Examinations Exemptions

Due to the pandemic, students were eligible for one or more exemptions from the requirements pertaining to passing Regents Examinations to be issued a diploma.

Passed a course that ordinarily culminated in a Regents examination; and



intended to take one or more Regents examinations during administration period(s) when exemptions were offered.

Exemptions remain with students through graduation

Eligibility Criteria:

NYSED guidance is that districts must ensure that students have had the instruction required to allow them the opportunity to demonstrate proficiency/mastery in the learning standards before taking the related Regents Examination.

0 Exemptions	13,671
1 Exemption	24,561
2 Exemptions	46,415
3 or More Exemptions	87,855
