



- support reforms ensuring that all students are college and career ready.



Certification Exam Pass Rates for Undergraduate Students, ATS-W and LAST (2011)





Certification Exam Pass Rates for Undergraduate and Graduate Students, Content Specialty Test (2011)






Placement of Program Completers and Employment


Undergraduate Student Employment in NYS Public Schools 1-5 Years Post Graduation

Percent Employed in NYS Public Schools X Years after Certification




School Building Leader Employment in NYS Public Schools 1-5 Years Post Graduation

Percent Employed in NYS Public Schools X Years after Certification




Employment of Program Completers by Need Resource Category



N/RC refers to school district classifications based on need/resource capacity categories. Data is reported for employment in New York City, the Big Four Cities (Buffalo, Rochester, Syracuse, and Yonkers), Urban/Suburban Schools with High Resource Needs, Rural Schools with High Resource Needs, Schools with Low Resource Needs, Charter Schools, and BOCES. The need/resource capacity index is a measure of a district's ability to meet the needs of its students with local resources. It is the ratio of the estimated poverty percentage (expressed in standard score form) to the Combined Wealth Ratio (expressed in standard score form).
