Problem Statement: The mechanics of educational inequality operate both as structural barriers around access and resources, and as internal functions of racism embedded in school policy and practice. These mechanisms have implications for achievement and opportunity, and perpetuate disparities among students based on race, ethnicity, gender, creed, culture, socioeconomic status, home zip code, language, special needs, and citizenship status. What social, political, policy, and legal obstacles must the Board of Regents confront to ensure all students have equitable opportunities to prepare for college, careers, and civic engagement? What leadership can the Board provide to remove these obstacles?
