# Subcommittee State Aid Proposals

Foundation Aid Details (\$283.3 million over current law growth)

- Supporting Districts Serving Students Experiencing Homelessness (0.12 weight)
- Supporting English language learners (0.60 weight)
- Minimum Increase adjusted by district need (2.0%)

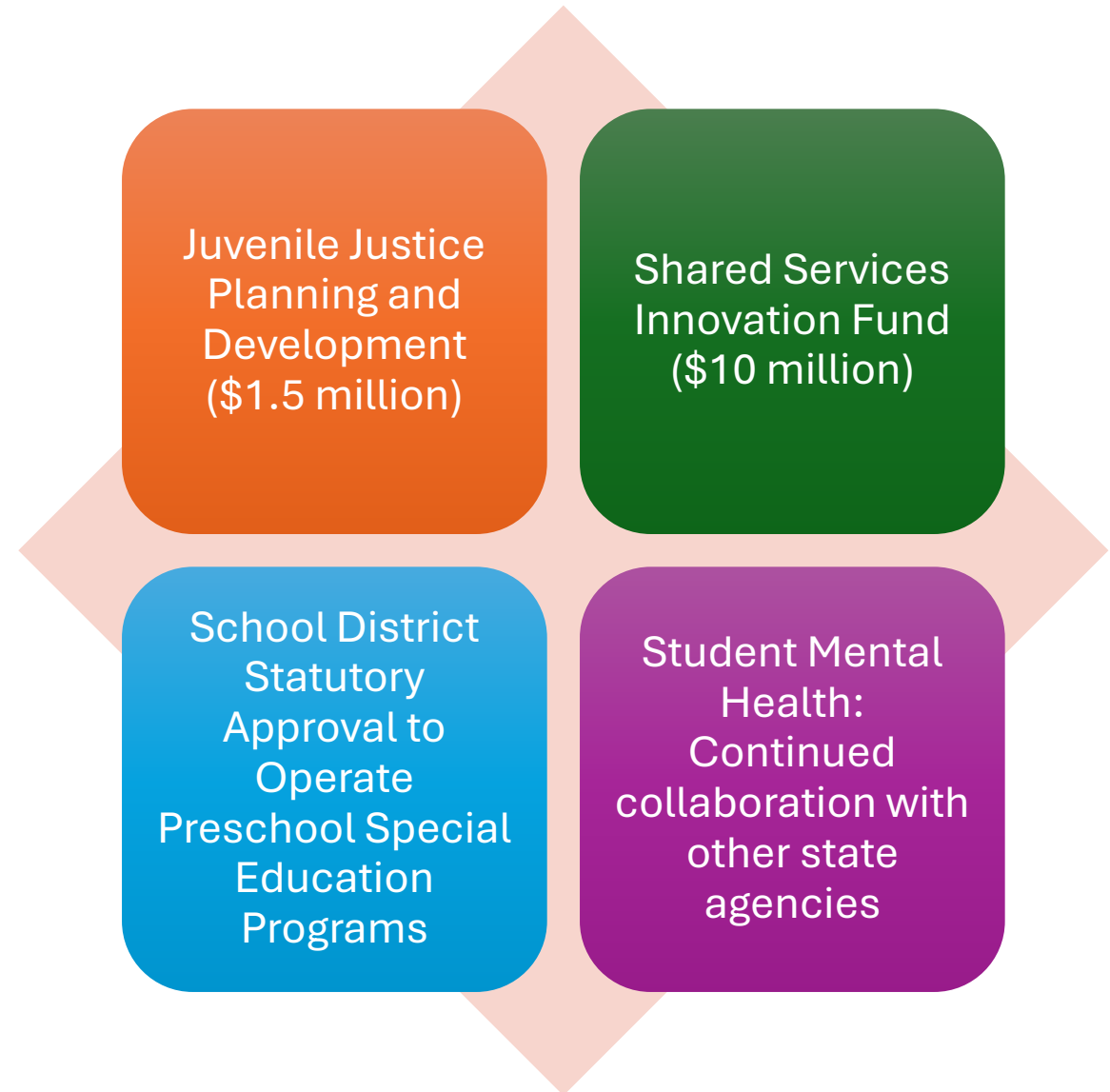
- Ongoing updates to Foundation Aid

# Special Education and Adult Career and Continuing Education Services (SE-ACCES) Committee Proposals

- Statutory changes supporting special education through age 22 (FAPE 22)

- Improve monitoring proprietary schools (zero cost)
- Removing contract barriers for adults with Disabilities Attending College (zero cost)

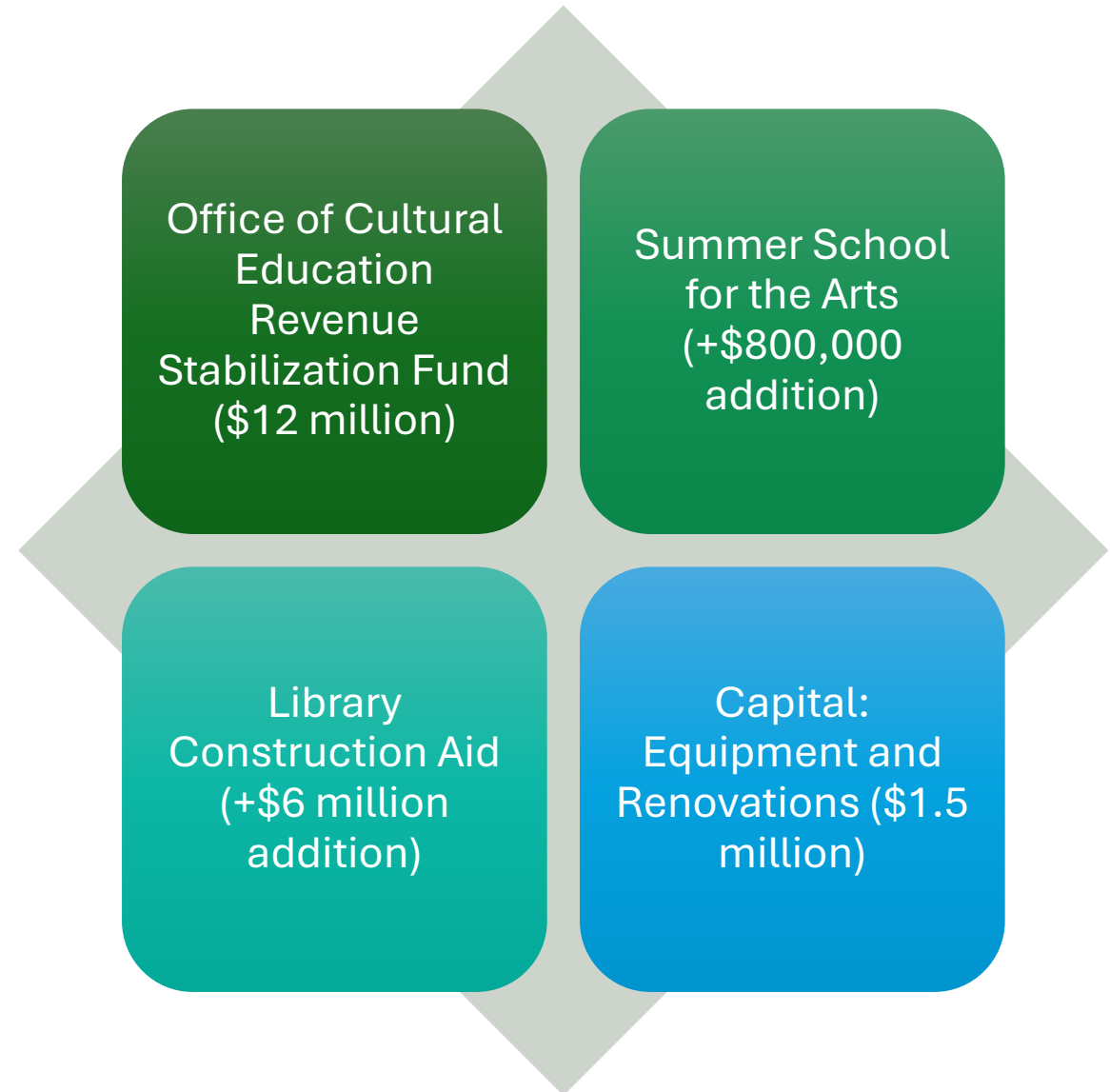
# Professional Practice Committee Proposals

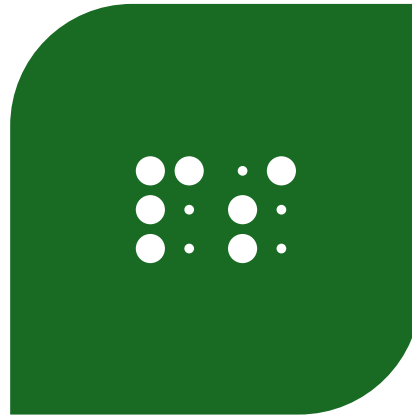
