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# Schenectady Smart Scholars Overview

- We are an ECHS serving over 400 students within Schenectady High School
- This June, our first cohort will be graduating
- Currently interviewing Cohort 3 candidates
- Academic pathways include: Humanities, Business, STEM, and CTE
- Summer college courses begin June 30 for all current and incoming students

### Program Demographics

(as of May 14, 2014)

- 410 total students in Cohort 1 and Cohort 2
  - Female: 59%
  - Male: 41%
  - Asian: 36%
  - African-American: 23%
  - Hispanic: 13%
  - White: 36%

## Program Highlights

- To date:
  - Collectively, students have earned over 1200 college credits
  - Seniors have earned, on average, 16 credits (August 2010-February 2014) with an additional 6 credits, on average, being earned during the current semester
  - Donation from The Schenectady Foundation provides funding for graphing calculators, assistance with tuition, summer transportation, and tutoring support for students

## Early College Components

#### Freshman Success Seminar

- First college course for incoming 9<sup>th</sup> graders
- Activates their SCCC transcript upon completion
