# AUTHORIZATION(S):

#### **SUMMARY**

I recommend that the Board of Regents approve a revision to the Kings Collegiate Charter School authorized by the Board of Trustees of the State University of New York (SUNY). The charter revision has been approved by the SUNY Board of Trustees in their capacity as charter school authorizers under Article 56 of the Education Law.

# **REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION**

The proposed revised charter: (1) meets the requirements set out in Article 56 of the Education Law, and all other applicable laws, rules and regulations; (2) will permit the charter schools to operate in an educationally and fiscally sound manner; (3) is likely to improve student learning and achievement and materially further the purposes set out in subdivision two of section twenty-eight hundred fifty of Article 56 of the Education Law; and, where applicable, granting this applications would have a significant educational benefit to the students expected to attend the charter school.

### **RECOMENDATION**

VOTED: That the Board of Regents approves the above listed charter revision as proposed by the Trustees of the State University of New York and the provisional charter is amended accordingly.

The Regents action on the above listed charter schools is effective immediately.
