## **SUMMARY**

I recommend that the Board of Regents approve the proposed renewal charter for Icahn Charter School 2 as proposed by the Board of Trustees of the State University of New York (SUNY) in its capacity as a charter school authorizer under Article 56 of the Education Law, and that the charter be extended for the term indicated.

The SUNY Board of Trustees provided the following information about the proposed short-term renewal of the charter for Icahn Charter School 2:

The Icahn Charter School 2 ("Icahn 2") utilized the 2006-2007 school year for planning purposes and opened in the fall of 2007. The 2010-2011 school year is therefore Icahn 2's fourth year of operation in Community School District 8. In order to accumulate a full five years of operational, financial and academic performance data before beginning the charter renewal process and to receive the full benefit of the intended five-year charter term, the school sought an extension to its charter from September 12, 2011 to July 30, 2012, with a projected enrollment of 252 students in grades K-6 in the 2011-12 school year.

## **RECOMENDATION**

VOTED: That the Board of Regents finds that the proposed charter school: (1) meets the requirements set out in Article 56 of the Education Law, and all other applicable laws, rules and regulations; (2) will operate in an educationally and fiscally sound manner; (3) is likely to improve student learning and achievement and materially further the purposes set out in subdivision two of section twenty-eight hundred fifty of Article 56 of the Education Law; and (4) will have a significant educational benefit to the students expected to attend the charter school, and the Board of Regents therefore approves and issues the first renewal charter of the Icahn Charter School 2 as proposed by the Board of Trustees of the State University of New York and that its provisional charter be extended for a term up through and including July 31, 2012.

The Regents action for the Icahn Charter School 2 will become effective immediately.
