# Issue for Consent Agenda

# Reason(s) for Consideration

## Proposed Handling

## Procedural History

Section 6506(5) of the Education Law and Section 24.7 of the Rules of the Board of Regents authorize the Regents to waive education, experience and examination requirements for a professional license as well as to confer the degree Doctor of Medicine.

# **Background Information**

There are 7 licensing petitions and 36 requests for the conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine for review and approval.

## **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Regents approve the recommendations of the Committee on the Professions regarding licensing petitions.

#### DENTISTRY

<u>12-04-50</u> Lena Alsabban San Antonio, TX

(King Abdulaziz University, Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, Bachelor in Dental Medicine and Surgery, June 2003)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Dr. Alsabban did not complete the required two academic years of study in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Such study is required for applicants completing a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school.

However, Dr. Alsabban has completed a four-year training program in oral and maxillofacial surgery that is accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation, from July 2008 to June 2012, with the first two years at the Medical College of Georgia and the final two years at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. The Director of the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Residency program at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. The Director of the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Residency program at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, Dr. Edward Ellis, submitted a letter attesting to the fact that Dr. Alsabban has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate from the University of Texas Health Science Center San Antonio Dental School.

The State Board for Dentistry recommends that, of the four academic years of study completed, two academic years be considered as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in Regulation, and two academic years be considered to fulfill the clinically-based dental residency program of at least one year's duration.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Dr. Guset did not complete the two academic years of study required in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Such study is required for applicants completing a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school. She enrolled in the two-year advanced program in general dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in June 2012. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in regulation.

<u>12-06-50</u> Germain Jean-Charles Pittsford, NY

(Universite d'Etat d'Haiti, Faculte d'Ontologie, Port-au-Prince, Haiti, Dental Surgeon, July 1999)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Regulations of the Commissioner require an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable pre-professional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of pre-professional and professional education. Dr. Jean-Charles completed a five-year combined pre-professional and professional dental education program at Universite d'Etat d'Haiti, Faculte d' Ontologie in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. Therefore, he lacks one year of education which is in the pre-professional area.

Dr. Jean-Charles also completed a three-year Residency in Oral and Maxilofacial Pathology at the University at Buffalo State University of New York in Buffalo, New York from August 2007 through July 2010. The State Board for Dentistry recommends that one year of this experience be considered to fulfill the remaining one year of required pre-professional education.

Additionally, Dr. Jean-Charles did not complete the two academic years of study required in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Such study is required for applicants completing a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school. He enrolled in the two-year advanced program in general dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in June 2012. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in regulation.

<u>12-07-50</u> Annette Lorenzo Reyes Rochester, NY

(Instituto Superior de Ciencias Medicas "Carlos J. Finlay" de Camaguey, Camaguey, Cuba, Doctor en Estomatologia, July 2001)

Petition for: Acceptance of education.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Regulations of the Commissioner require an applicant for licensure in dentistry to complete an acceptable pre-professional education program of at least two years in length (including courses in general chemistry, organic chemistry, biology or zoology, and physics) and an acceptable professional dental education program of at least four years in length, for a total of six years of pre-professional and professional education. Dr. Lorenzo Reyes completed a five-year combined pre-professional and professional dental education program at Instituto Superior de Ciencias Medicas "Carlos J. Finlay" de Camaguey in Camaguey, Cuba. Therefore, she lacks one year of education which is in the pre-professional area.

Following dental school, Dr. Lorenzo Reyes also completed a two-year Especialista Estomatologia General Integral program at Instituto Superior de Ciencias Medicas "Carlos J. Finlay" de Camaguey in November 2006. Based on a review of Dr. Lorenzo Reyes' advanced studies at Instituto Superior de Ciencias Medicas "Carlos J. Finlay" de Camaguey, the State Board for Dentistry recommends that these studies be considered to fulfill the remaining one year of required pre-professional education.

Additionally, Dr. Lorenzo Reyes did not complete the two academic years of study required in an accredited dental school program culminating in certification that the applicant has achieved the level of knowledge and clinical proficiency expected of a graduate of that school. Such study is required for applicants completing a program of dental education in an unregistered or unaccredited dental school. She enrolled in the two-year advanced program in general dentistry at the Eastman Institute for Oral Health of the University of Rochester and completed the program in December 2011. This program is acknowledged by the State Board for Dentistry as the substantial equivalent of the two-year program required in regulation.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Dentistry, recommends that the applicant's preprofessional and professional education requirements be considered fulfilled.

#### VETERINARY MEDICINE

<u>12-05-75</u> Scott Elwood Palmer Millstone Township, NJ 08535

(University of Pennsylvania, School of Veterinary Medicine, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, V.M. D., 1976)

<u>Petition for</u>: Waiver of New York State requirements pertaining to acceptability of licensing examinations for licensure by endorsement.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Dr. Palmer graduated from an accredited college of veterinary medicine in the United States in 1976 and was licensed in Pennsylvania on the basis of acceptable scores on the National Board Examination (NBE). Since Pennsylvania's records were destroyed by fire, his actual 1976 NBE score is not now reportable. The American Association of Veterinary State Boards reports that based on the recorded mean and standard deviation for his exam, the passing scores in Pennsylvania and New York would have been the same. Additionally, Dr. Palmer has not taken the Clinical Competency Test (CCT) that was required for licensure with the NBE (first offered in 1984) or the replacement North American Veterinary Licensing Examination (which was first offered in 2000).

Based on Dr. Palmer's documentation of clinical competence, the State Board for Veterinary Medicine recommends waiver of the CCT examination requirement and acceptance of the applicant's license for endorsement in New York State.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Veterinary Medicine, recommends that the examination requirement be waived and that the applicant's license be endorsed.

#### VETERINARY MEDICINE

<u>12-09-75</u> Shlomit Levy Tennenboim Ra'anana, Israel

(University of Bologna, Bologna, Italy, D.V.M., 1982)

<u>Petition for</u>: Waiver of New York State requirements pertaining to acceptability of education and licensing examinations for licensure by endorsement.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: As a graduate of a veterinary medicine program not accredited by the American Veterinary Medicine Association, Dr. Levy Tennenboim is required to document completion of satisfactory clinical education equivalent to the clinical training in an accredited veterinary medical program, such as certification by the Educational Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates (ECFVG). Dr. Levy Tennenboim is unable to document a year of clinical education, though she has documented numerous seminar hours in avian veterinary medicine, etc. She did not do the ECFVG program.

In addition, Dr. Levy Tennenboim passed the December 1983 National Board Examination (NBE) but not the Clinical Competency Test (CCT). For New York State licensure, an applicant who passed the NBE must also pass the CCT, which was offered from 1984 until 2000. The CCT and the NBE have been replaced by the North American Veterinary Licensing Examination (NAVLE). In addition to the NBE examination, Dr. Levy Tennenboim also passed for California licensure the California State Board Exam, a written (practical) examination and has maintained licensure there since 1984.

In view of Dr. Levy Tennenboim's documentation of 28 years of licensed practice in California and Israel as evidence of clinical competence, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Veterinary Medicine recommends that the year of clinical education be waived and the applicant's license be accepted for endorsement in New York State, waiving the requirements of the CCT examination and the year of clinical training.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Committee on the Professions, in concurrence with the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Veterinary Medicine, recommends that the clinical education requirement and the clinical competency test examination requirement be waived and that the applicant's license be endorsed.

#### MEDICINE

<u>12-65-60</u> Luigi Di Biase Austin, Texas 78702

(Universita Degli Studi di Bari, Bari, Italy, Diploma of Medicine and Surgery, July 2000)

Petition for: Endorsement of his medical license from Italy.

<u>Statement of Problem</u>: Commissioner's Regulations allow for endorsement of an applicant's license from another jurisdiction if appropriate requirements are met, and if the applicant has not failed any part of New York State's licensing examination (USMLE). A license granted in a country outside the United States can be endorsed if licensure in that country is regulated by an organization designated as responsible for quality assurance and acceptable to the Board of Regents. Additionally, the applicant must satisfactorily demonstrate completion of an acceptable proficiency examination (ECFMG), clinical competency examination, three years of American Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training or the equivalent, and five years of satisfactory professional experience.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the documentation of foreign and unaccredited training submitted in support of Dr. Di Biase's application. He recommends that Dr. Di Biase's Residency in Cardiology in Italy and Fellowships in Ohio and Texas be accepted as the substantial equivalent of the required three years of ACGME-accredited postgraduate training.

Commissioner's Regulations also allow the Board of Regents to accept appropriate foreign medical licenses to fulfill the licensure requirements and diplomate certificates obtained on the basis of satisfying experience and examination requirements to fulfill the proficiency and clinical competency requirements for licensure by endorsement.

Dr. Di Biase obtained his medical license in Italy in 2001. His license is active and in good standing. Dr. Di Biase further obtained his specialty diploma in Cardiology from the Universita Degli Studi di Bari in 2005, a Master's degree in Cardiac Electrophysiology and Cardiac Pacing from the Universita Degli Studi Dell'Insubria in 2007, and a Doctorate of Philosophy (Ph.D.) in Physiopathology and Clinics of Cardiovascular and Respiratory System from the Universita Degli Studi di Foggia in 2010. Dr. Di Biase has not attempted any part of the New York State proficiency or licensing examinations.

The Executive Secretary of the State Board for Medicine has reviewed the additional qualifications presented by Dr. Di Biase and recommends that his Italian license be endorsed and that his master's and doctoral degrees be accepted to fulfill the proficiency examination requirement. He further recommends that Dr. Di Biase's specialty diploma in Cardiology be considered to fulfill the clinical competency requirement for endorsement.

<u>Petition for</u>: Conferral of the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) pursuant to Section 6529 of the Education Law.

<u>Summary Statement</u>: The petitioners listed below are all graduates of foreign medical schools who have been licensed in New York.

The applicable requirements of Section 3.57 of the Rules of the Board of Regents require completion of a medical education program in a foreign medical school satisfactory to the Department which does not grant the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), and in which the philosophy and curriculum were equivalent, as determined by the Department in accordance with the policy of the Board of Regents, to those in programs leading to the degree Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) at medical schools in the United States satisfactory to, or registered by, the Board of Regents and the Department. Secondly, petitioners must have licensure to practice medicine in New York State in accordance with provisions of Section 6524 or 6528 of the Education Law or their equivalent as determined by the Board of Regents pursuant to their authority under Section 6506 of the Education Law.
